WHEAT MARKETS BARELY STEADY

Feed Grains are Slightly Lower—World Supplies Smaller Than 1929.

WASHINGTON, Apr. 14 (Special)—Domestic wheat markets were barely steady during the week ending April 12, with the influence of less favorable prospects for winter wheat offset by that of large North American stocks and continued small takings by European and Oriental buyers, according to the weekly grain market review of the United States bureau of agricultural economics.

Corresponding time last year. Southern hemisphere supplies, however, are only about one-half as large as a year ago, with 100,000,000 to 110,000,000 bushels yet available for export from Argentina and Australia, according to official estimates.

Stocks on ocean passage are less than half as large as at this time last season, and totaled only 33,000,000 bushels, compared with 65,000,000 bushels a year ago. The first estimate of the Indian wheat crop in the Punjab is 146,422,000 bushels, compared with the final estimate for that area last season of 127,782,000 bushels.
