When the stock market goes down, blood pressure goes up.

The stock market is a relatively recent institution, but the study of blood pressure is almost as old as the science of medicine. The ancient physicians placed much diagnostic value on the pulse, and on the basis of its character attempted to diagnose illness, prescribe treatment and forecast results. But before the invention of dependable time-measures and of some means for measuring blood pressure most of the true message of the pulse was uninterpretable to the observer. One of the earliest attempts to time the pulse was made by Galileo in the seventeenth century. He once observed the swinging of a suspended lamp in a cathedral and noted that, no matter how large the arc, the time consumed in its swing from one extreme to the other was the same. Since he did not have a watch by which to time the swinging, this ingenious thinker conceived the idea of using his steady pulse as a measure.

Then, reversing the process, he measured the pulse by the time it took to swing a pendulum with a cord of varying length. The faster the pulse the shorter the pendulum. The longer the pendulum the more time it takes to complete its swing. If pulse and pendulum keep in time, pulse rate could be measured by the length of the pendulum. An ingenious idea! But neither pulse nor blood pressure could really be understood until the functions of the heart and of the circulatory system were known.

This knowledge was given us by a contemporary of Galileo, the great William Harvey. On the basis of Harvey's discovery it was subsequently possible for Stephen Hales, a clergyman, without a medical degree, to study blood pressure and to give us a first mean for its measurement. It required the work of many other scientists, among them some of the most famous physiologists, to give us the blood pressure instrument of today.

eggs, dried, 2 tablespoons chopped sweet pickles, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon paprika, 1-2 cup salad dressing.
Mix and chill ingredients. Serve on lettuce.
Creole Rice, Serving 6
2 slices bacon, cut fine, 3 tablespoons chopped onions, 3 tablespoons chopped green peppers, 3 cups rice, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon celery, 1/4 teaspoon celery salt, 2 cups tomatoes.
Place bacon in frying pan. Heat slowly until bacon becomes crisp, then add onions and green peppers and cook slowly 5 minutes. Add rice and cook until browned a little. Add rest of ingredients and cook 5 minutes.

French Dressing
1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon sugar, 1/4 teaspoon paprika, 1/4 teaspoon celery seed, 1-2 cup lemon juice, 2-3 cup salad oil.
Place ingredients in wide mouthed bottle. Cork tightly, shake 2 minutes. Chill. When ready to use, shake and serve on head lettuce, vegetable or fruit salads.
Jam Filling for White Cake
2-3 cup strawberry jam, 2 tablespoons butter, 1-2 cup confectioner's sugar, 1/4 teaspoon salt.
Mix ingredients and beat 2 minutes. Use as filling.
If pink color is desired to aid a color scheme, whipped cream can be tinted with vegetable coloring and makes a pretty dessert when served on top of white cake.
Frost caramel cakes with white or caramel frosting.

Melt butter and add flour; when blended add milk and cook until thick creamy sauce forms. Stir constantly to prevent lumping. Add tuna, seasonings and egg yolks. Beat three minutes. Fold in egg
