1929 Big League Champions Open Season in Imposing Fashion

The two champions of 1929, the Philadelphia Athletics and Chicago Cubs, resumed their places at the top of the standings with victories over the New York Yankees and St. Louis Cardinals respectively.

The Athletics, led by the hero, first baseman Lefty Grove, gained a 6 to 2 victory over the Cubs with comparative ease. Grove yielded only six hits and four runs while Al Simmons and Max Bishop collected the runs.

The Cubs engaged in a clotting duel at St. Louis and barely edged out a 3 to 2 triumph. The National League, engaged in the day's tightest duel, the Philadelphia Phillies and Brooklyn Dodgers, pitched a Brooklyn line, outpitched the rival southpaw, Bill Clarke...
