MISSIONARY IS SAFE IN HANKOW Miss Nina E. Gemmill Returns From Bandit Camp In Kangsi Province. HANKOW, April 16 (AP)—Miss Nina E. Gemmill, an American missionary formerly of Girard, Kans., and Tacoma, Wash., arrived here today from a bandit's camp in Kangsi province mountains where she had been held for ransom. As a result of her experiences since she was kidnaped March 27 in a raid upon Yuanchow, Kans., Miss Gemmill is confined to bed, highly nervous and unable to make a statement. It is understood, however, that the bandits released her, hoping to persuade the mission officials to pay the demanded ransom of \$50,000 Mexican (\$20,000 gold).
