**Strawberry Turnovers**  
Two cups flour.  
Four teaspoons baking powder.  
One-half teaspoon salt.  
Four tablespoons lard.  
One egg.  
Two-thirds cup milk.  
Two cups berries.  
One-half cup sugar.  
Two tablespoons butter.  
Mix flour, baking powder, salt, cut in lard with knife; Add egg and milk. When soft dough forms put out on floured board until dough is one-fourth inch thick. Divide in six pieces, add portions of berries which have been mixed with sugar. Roll with butter, draw up edges of dough around berries. Place on greased baking sheet and bake 20 minutes. Serve warm.
