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6 tablespoons flour
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1/2 teaspoon celery salt
1/2 teaspoon finely chopped onions
3 cups milk
2 egg yolks
2 tablespoons finely chopped parsley
1 egg
6 egg whites, stiffly beaten.
Melt butter, add flour, salt, pepper, celery salt. Add onion and milk and cook until creamy sauce forms. Stir frequently. Add egg yolks and beat three minutes. Add parsley and fold in egg whites. Pour into buttered, individual molds. Set in pan of hot water and bake 25 minutes in moderately slow oven. Unmold carefully and surround with mushroom sauce.

Mushroom Sauce
4 tablespoons butter
4 tablespoons flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1 cup cooked, diced mushrooms
2 cups milk
Melt butter and add flour, salt, pepper, mushrooms. Cook slowly until mushrooms have browned. Stir frequently. Add milk and cook until sauce thickens.

Muffins, Serving 6
3 cups pastry flour
6 tablespoons baking powder
2-3 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup sugar
1 1/2 cups milk
3 tablespoons butter, melted.
Mix flour, baking powder, salt, sugar. Add other ingredients and beat three minutes. Half fill greased muffin pans, bake 15 minutes in a moderate oven. Serve hot with butter.

Ice Box Sugar Cookies
2-3 cup fat
1 1/2 cups sugar
3 eggs
3 tablespoons cream
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon salt
3 cups flour
