Broad jump: Torrington, Conley, Vautt, Evans, Hubbard, Stoop, Waite.

Discus: Fann, Waite, Evans, DeLong.
Four Records in Danger
Several records are in danger, and there is a strong likelihood that at least two—the shotput and discus—will be bettered by Harold Joslin, of Baker. Newland is considered a chance to lower the 120-yard high hurdle mark and with two or three athletes over the mountains leaping over 20 feet in the broad jump, there is an outside chance that that mark will be bettered. None of the others seem in danger, although a dickerhorse might come in from a smaller school to upset the dog.

Half-mile relay: La Grande, Pendleton teams, 1:25 1/2.

The Eastern Oregon field records follow:
Javelin: Gilliam, Baker, 1925, 133 feet 1/2 inches.
Pole vault: Fann, Conley, 1925, 11 feet 2 inches.
Broad jump: Allen, Pendleton, 1927, 21 feet 2 1/2 inches.
High jump: Hubbard, Pendleton, 1924, 4 feet 3 1/2 inches.
Shotput: Jones, Baker, 1925, 44 feet 1 inch.
Discus: King, Pendleton, 1927, 113 feet 2 1/2 inches.
Each Winner Seven Times
Since 1925 both La Grande and Pendleton have won seven events. Baker has taken two and Conley one. If either La Grande or Pendleton is winner it will make the definite ascendancy of the two over the Bakers. The two schools have almost done so since 1925, but had been the Baker team.
