Health Talks

SLEEPLESSNESS
Sleeplessness, like headache, is not a disease in the true sense of the term, but rather a symptom of some underlying condition.

Insomnia may be due to some physical condition such as pain, cough, or shortness of breath. Again it may be due to some emotional or psychological state, such as anxiety, fear or depression.

Where there is a physical cause for the sleeplessness, it is of course logical to treat it by having the physical disability removed or remedied. A physical cause, however, is not as easily cured as the first type.

Occasional insomnia need not trouble the sufferer much but persistent insomnia needs attention, for the tendency is for the condition to progress rather than to cure itself.

Often the cause for the inability to fall asleep is self evident to the sufferer, and consequently suggests its own remedy. It may be due to excess fatigue, or to undue excitement. Quiet and rest are the remedy.

child should be instituted.

At night the child suffering from enuresis should be awakened after the second hour of sleep, or earlier, if the child is found to wet its bed sooner.

In the uncomplicated cases such training will, if kept up long enough, prove effective. It must be remembered, however, that there are a number of cases where the situation is complicated by emotional and other disturbances. Such cases will need the most expert of medical and psychological help.

The Insulating Wall Board.
It's fine for insulating your attic or for any other place where a high grade insulating board is required. It's a full half inch thick.

Parents and physicians are sorely tried in the effort to overcome this condition, and often success comes only after sustained effort.

The child must learn control, and this is normally done by the end of the second year. If the child persists in wetting its bed at night, and particularly if it lacks control during the day, the condition is no longer normal.

Enuresis may be due to physical defects, or to faulty training. It is imperative that every child suffering from enuresis should be given a careful physical examination, including the nervous system.

Where there is a physical fault found its correction should be undertaken. Under all circumstances, however, proper training of the

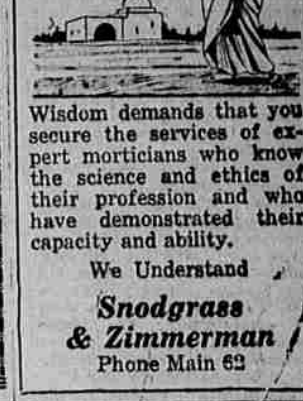
