One-half cup molasses.
Two teaspoons cinnamon.
One teaspoon cloves.
One-half teaspoon nutmeg.
One-fourth teaspoon salt.
One cup water.
Two and one-half cups flour.
One teaspoon soda.
One teaspoon baking powder.
Cream fat and sugar. Add other
ingredients and beat 2 minutes.
Half fill greased muffin pans and
bake 20 minutes in moderately
