"Rob Rich; Help Poor" Is Slogan Of Chinese Woman "Robin Hood"

PEIPING (AP)—"Rob the rich; help the poor." So goes the slogan of China's woman "Robin Hood."

Swinging down upon prosperous village bank or holding up a train, she gathers loot enough to provide square meals for a few days in some other village stricken by poverty or famine.

"Marshall Chang," the common people call her, and the title is not unwarranted, for several thousand followers obey her commands. It is reported, her bandit army is well equipped with arms and ammunition bought from deserting soldiers of the Chinese civil war armies.

Great ceremony attends her appearance in a village of poor people, for they know her arrival means the distribution of either grain or money to the needy.

"Marshall Chang" believes in advertising. Wherever she goes handbills appear with the slogans: "Rob the rich; help the poor," "Support the cause of Marshall Chang," "Marshall Chang is the salvation star of the poor people," etc.

Once this Chinese bandit Amazon was a law-abiding citizen. It was on a farm with her husband and children. They had a few cows, a donkey or two, chickens and ducks, and were fairly prosperous.

Then one night the Chang place was robbed and the husband murdered. The widow swore revenge, sold all her possessions, turned bandit herself and began her depredations.

Military leaders have tried vainly to persuade her to give up banditry. She has refused alike offers of a "pension" or to join her forces with some military organization.

NEW COTTON USES OFFSET ITS DECLINE IN CLOTHING

Murder Charge Placed Against Wealthy Rancher

SAN FRANCISCO, May 14 (AP)—A first degree murder charge was placed Tuesday against J. Warren Dutton, 36, wealthy Mendocino county rancher, following the death of 20-year-old Robert Arnold, taxi driver, shot five times by the rancher while riding in the youth's cab.

Arnold, a bridegroom of less than six months, died at Mt. Zion hospital with his mother and 13-year-old bride at his bedside.

The apparently unprovoked attack occurred as Arnold was driving Dutton up Powell street to a fashionable Nob Hill apartment. Without warning, Dutton drew his revolver and sent five bullets into the youth's body. Young Arnold collapsed and the car crashed into a building. The rancher fled, but surrendered a short time later.

At police headquarters, Dutton described the shooting and became hysterical. He struggled furiously when officers attempted to put him in a cell, ripping a telephone from the wall and shouting threats. Hours of questioning failed to elicit a coherent story and the reason for the attack still remained unexplained.

Dutton's wife, the former Katherine Fletcher of San Rafael, brought suit for divorce at Ukiah three months ago, charging mental and physical cruelty. She was admitted as a patient at the University of California hospital a few days ago. Dutton is a member of the pioneer Salano county family which founded Dutton's landing.

Caspar Ornbahn, San Francisco attorney who is associated with Dutton in the Greenwood ranch on the Mendocino coast, said Dutton would enter a "not guilty by reason of insanity" plea when arraigned. Dutton, he said, was a frequent sufferer of hallucinations and probably was the victim of one when he shot Arnold.

IMMIGRATION BILL IS AIMED AT MEXICANS

WASHINGTON, May 14 (AP)—A bill placing immigration quota restrictions upon Mexico was passed yesterday by the senate without a record vote and sent to the house.

By 51 to 16, the senate voted to place Mexico alone of western nations under a quota. The bill originally called for placing all Central and South American countries under quota restrictions. The drastic alteration was agreed upon at the suggestion of Senator Harris, democrat, Georgia, sponsor of the measure. Then the bill was approved without a record vote.

2 hard cooked eggs, sliced.

- Parsley Sauce
2 tablespoons butter.
4 tablespoons flour.
1/2 teaspoon salt.
1-4 teaspoon paprika.
2 cups milk.
2 tablespoons finely chopped parsley.
1 egg, hard cooked and sliced.
Melt butter and add flour, salt, paprika and milk. Add other ingredients. Cook 1 minute and serve.

(To be used as filling and frosting for three layer white cake).
3 cups sugar.
1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar.
1 1/2 cups water.

- 3 egg whites.
1 teaspoon vanilla.
1/2 teaspoon lemon extract.
2-3 cup chopped figs.
1/2 cup raisins.
1/2 cup red cherries.
1-3 cup broken nut meats.
Mix sugar, cream of tartar and water. Cook over moderate fire and without stirring until thread forms when portion is slowly poured from spoon. Pour into beaten egg whites and beat until thick, creamy and cool. Add other ingredients and frost cake.

Health Talks

TOE IN OR OUT?

A leading New York physician offers as a popular slogan the motto: "Feeble feet make feeble people." Drawing on experience, he observes that persons with disabled lower extremities suffer a severe and immediate loss of their sweet dispositions. "Ask anyone," he says, "who has ever disputed with a fat and angry cook, or a peevish traffic policeman."

The weakening of the feet, he observes, is accompanied by a slow and usually unremarked change in the sufferer's habits. Where once he ran, he now walks. Where he once walked, he now takes a car. Where he stood he sits. Where he smiled he snaps. The persons suffering from weak feet may also suffer a sense of general fatigue, disinclination to effort and unwillingness to move from place to place. There may be pain in the calves of the legs, and continuous aching in the arch of the foot, usually made worse by standing. Pain in the "small" of the back is not uncommon.

A weakened foot needs careful handling but a poor foot properly used may still prove serviceable. The proper use of the foot calls for toiling in. The whole foot should be placed upon the ground lightly and softly, one in front of the other, as if walking a tight rope. The steps should be shorter and if necessary the knees may be slightly bent.

While the sudden changing from a less comfortable to a so-called sensible shoe may cause one, contrary to expectations, to suffer a d-d-d discomforts and pains, good shoes contribute to foot health.

A good shoe should have the following points: a fairly low, broad heel, a narrow shank
