Bobby was brief in his comment after the victory.

"We are happy to have won," he said.

All the other members of the team were particularly enthusiastic over the great victory of Don Moe, the baby of the team and all congratulated him enthusiastically.

The news of Glenn Collett's defeat at Forbury was a blow to the American camp and the Walker Cup players seemed more surprised and downcast over her loss than elated over their victory at Sandwich.

Moe's round against Stout made galling history for Sandwich. Four down at luncheon, the University of Oregon student came back with a brand of golf in the afternoon that could not be denied.

Three Threes in a Row
