Revival Meeting To Close Friday

The Packard and Neely revival at the Central Christian church begins the last week of the series Sunday. A record breaking attendance is expected at all the services during the day. The goal has been set for 400 in the Bible school. Dr. Packard will speak and conduct a decision service in the school. At 11 o'clock his theme, "Why Did Jesus Come?" The evangelist's noted sermon, "The Unpardonable Sin," will be delivered in the evening. A packed house is expected. Friday's sermon, "The Second Coming of Jesus," drew the largest "sweet-spirit" audience. The evangelist called attention to the fact that there are 500 statements in the Bible concerning His second coming.
