RALPH HILL SETS NEW MILE MARK

Oregon Runner Covers Distance in 4:12 2-5 — Oregon Defeats Huskies

HAYWARD FIELD, Eugene, Ore., May 19 (AP)—Clipping three and two-fifths of a second from the world intercollegiate record for the mile run, Ralph Hill, Oregon, established a new mark of 4:12 2-5 for the distance in a dual meet here against University of Washington Saturday. The Oregonians defeated Washington 53 1-2 to 61 2-2. Hill's time bettered that of John Paul Jones, formerly of Cornell, who in 1912, did the mile in 4:15 4-5. Rufus Kizer, of Washington, national champion, was six yards behind Hill, and collapsed at the line. Oregon won the century when Tyrell Lowery won the distance 19-2. Victorious in the pole vault, the 6-footers then took the two-mile run by the longest margin, as Clarence Hill went that distance in 5:24.4, finishing more than 20 yards ahead of the nearest Husky contender.
