Three Thousand Dollars
to be Spent on Structure
on Hemlock Street.

The total value of new construction in La Grande this year came closer to the quarter-million mark during the last week, and at the close of business Saturday was \$234,455.

New building last week amounted to \$4500, headed up by the \$3000 garage building which Kuhn and Zweifel are building on Hemlock.

Another permit was issued to Mrs. Lucy Graham to repair the house that was damaged by fire last week.

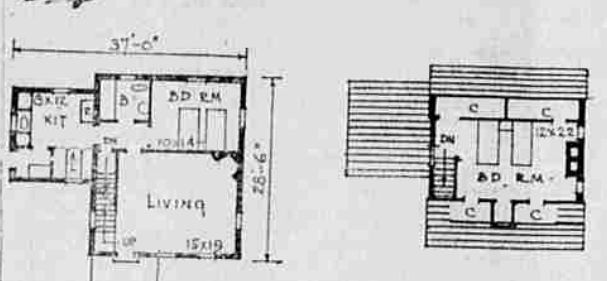
Wiring Station.—The Electric Service store has started work on the wiring for the Union Oil station at the corner of Adams and Hemlock.

This little cottage may be built as a summer camp at a reasonable cost, particularly if there is stone readily available that may be used in construction.

The first floor plan includes a large living room, a bedroom and bath and a kitchen with a dining alcove. On the second floor there is a large bedroom with several closets. This may be utilized to accommodate a number of guests when occasion requires.

The front porch is of wood, which should be painted white. All other woodwork likewise should be in white. Weathered dark brown or gray shingles should be used for the roof.

If the builder is ambitious and desires to superintend the building or do it himself, the house may be constructed for \$2,000 or \$3,000 if

STORM, FLOOD IN ARKANSAS CAUSE DEATH

The high water disrupted highway traffic generally over the state and interrupted rail traffic in South Arkansas.

In addition to the Red river and Smackover creek, the Ouachita river was overflowing lowlands with much higher stages predicted for Camden and Arkadelphia.

The tornado at Elaine and vicinity demolished tenant houses on the plantation of G. L. Lambert, of St. Louis. Most of the houses situated near a levee protecting the plantation from the Mississippi river were swept into an adjacent swamp and with them went the bodies of several victims.

Three negroes who escaped said they were playing cards when the tornado appeared. They said the storm lifted the house from over their heads, leaving them seated at their card table. After they fled, the floor and table were swept into the swamp by a second part of the tornado.

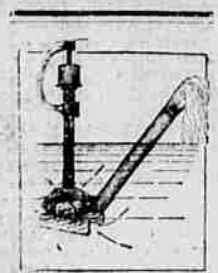
