## Health Talks

The Bathing  
When bathtubs were introduced in the United States in 1849, they met with such opposition as did the very practical wrist watch at first.

Politicians declared with rounded rhetoric how these new-fangled ideas were bound to undermine the institutions of our forefathers. Even doctors held them up as a menace to health. In 1843, West Virginia put a yearly tax of \$30.00 on every bathtub, and a Boston municipal ordinance made the use of them unlawful except when ordered by physicians.

In spite of these laws, however, the bathtub has become recognized as an essential rather than a luxury. We have learned that for health's sake, our skin must be kept clean.

The bath requires three elements—water, soap and "bathing attitude." There are many kinds of baths, three among which are important, the cleansing, the warm soothing and the cold invigorating.

The cleansing bath is a hot one, the temperature of the water ranging from 98 to 104 degrees Fahrenheit. The value of this bath is directly proportionate to the amount of soap suds we produce by rubbing soap on the body and by using a wash cloth or a bath brush. It is important when taking a cleansing bath to remove all soap from the body and after the bath, it is advisable, although not absolutely necessary, to cool the body with cold water.

The warm soothing bath is pleasant before retiring at night. It differs from the cleansing bath in having a lower temperature.

The cold shower is of value in the morning, but it should be a pleasure and not a torture.

the most successful teachers are the quiet ones.  
I suspect that there is some definite connection between the quiet manner and the good discipline of eager, interested children.

The quiet teacher is a person who is so sure of herself that she can afford to be quiet.  
She is so interested in her charges that she does not herself perpetually seek the limelight. She receives respect without demanding it. Her students like her and trust her and give their best energies to their work.

Many a parent could learn a great deal from such a teacher. The average mother spends a great deal of useless energy in commanding, and exhorting when it should be necessary only to suggest.

She has herself not yet acquired the self-control which she must have before she can hope successfully to control another human being, even though he be only a two year old. The use of anger and exhortation when it should be only necessary for her to speak quietly.

Of course the child who has been subjected to the loud manner grows so used to it that he will respond to nothing else and the vociferous mother finds herself growing more and more vociferous.

It is just as easy to teach a child to respond to a quiet voice as to a loud one and it is a good deal better for the nerves and sanity of all concerned.

If you have a young child, the quiet manner is worth trying to cultivate. Demand it of yourself, your will also learn the self-control or which it is the expression.

Sliced Roast Beef

3 pieces thinly cut white bread,  
1-2 cup chopped cooked meat,  
2 tablespoons chopped sweet pickles,  
1-8 teaspoon salt,  
3 tablespoons salad dressing,  
3 tablespoons soft butter

Arrange bread slices in palm and cover half with soft butter and other with rest of ingredients mixed. Arrange sandwich fashion. Press firmly and cut in halves. Place in a toaster until well browned. Serve at once.

Hate Cookies  
2-3 cup fat,  
1-2 cups light brown sugar,  
2 eggs,  
2-2 cup chopped dates,  
1-2 cup nuts, chopped,  
1 teaspoon cinnamon,  
1-2 teaspoon cloves,  
1-4 teaspoon salt,  
4 tablespoons cream,  
1 teaspoon vanilla,  
2-1-2 cups flour,  
1 teaspoon cream of tartar,  
Cream fat and sugar. Add eggs and beat 2 minutes. Add rest of ingredients and break off bits of dough and flatten down, 3 inches apart on greased baking sheets. Bake 12 minutes in moderate oven. Tomato Gelatin  
2 cups tomato,  
1 cup boiling water,  
1 teaspoon sugar,  
4 whole cloves,  
1 slice onion,  
2 bay leaves,  
1-2 teaspoon salt,  
2 tablespoons granulated gelatin,  
1 cup finely chopped celery,  
1-4 cup chopped green peppers,  
1-4 cup chopped green olives,  
301 tomatoes, boiling water, sugar, cloves, onion, bay leaves and salt. Cool slowly in covered

pan 20 minutes. Strain thoroughly. Soak gelatin and cold water 5 minutes. Add strained tomato mixture, heated to the boiling point. Stir well. Cool. Add rest of ingredients. Pour into mold and chill. Unmold on lettuce; serve with mayonnaise.
