The double defeat checked the Philadelphia prospects of overtaking Washington's league leaders as the Senators took two games from the Boston Red Sox. Washington pulled out a 3-2 opening victory in a duel between Dimp Hadley and Milton Gaston as each yielded five hits. Then they stepped out to hit 13 times in the second game and win 13 to 1, increasing their margin to three full games.

Two neat pitching jobs altered the second division standing, sending the St. Louis Browns into fifth place and the Detroit Tigers to seventh while Chicago and Boston dropped to sixth and eighth respectively. Collins and Holshouser of the Browns gave Cleveland seven hits while St. Louis bled seven runs off of Clint Brown in one inning for a 3 to 2 victory. George Uhle of Detroit gave Chicago but six hits for a 6 to 1 triumph.

Cardinals Take Lead

First place in the National league passed into the hands of the St. Louis Cardinals as they gave the Cincinnati Reds their seventh straight defeat, 4 to 2 while the Boston Braves were beating out Brooklyn 5 to 2. Brooklyn found old Socks Seibold a bit too much as he pitched his eighth complete game of the season and drove in the winning run himself with a single in the ninth inning. It was Seibold's sixth victory.

Chuck Klein, leading home run hitter of the National league last season, found the range in the Polo grounds in the twelfth inning to decide a struggle between the Phillies and the New York Giants in which homers were almost as big a feature as they were in the American league Philadelphia-New York game. Klein's homer, with one on base, gave the Phillies a 10 to 8 victory and their first triumph over the Giants this season. The Chicago Cubs likewise did some range finding to make 13 hits good for a 12 to 5 victory over the Pittsburgh Pirates, who made the game number of blows.

MISTAKES OF WAR ARE POINTED OUT BY GERMAN PRINCE

"In no circumstances should I have allowed the Austrians, after only a hasty perusal of Serbia's reply, to pronounce it inadequate, to sever all diplomatic relations and start military activities.

A Grave Blunder
"Nor should I have had Germany send France and Russia a declaration of war and thereby estranged first Romania and then Italy from our central European ally agreement. Heroin Von Bethmann and Von Jagow, committed a grave blunder.

"Of course, I should never have agreed to an invasion of Belgium as long as the Belgian neutrality was not being violated by our adversaries.

"I doubt whether I would have permitted the submarine campaign, certainly not at the time and in the circumstances in which unfortunately this mode of warfare was introduced.

"And I should have insisted that

immediately after the outbreak of the war our navy go into action irrespective of the risk or peril involved."

THREE NATIONS MATCH WITS FOR LEAD IN TIRE TRADE

WASHINGTON (AP)—A three-cornered battle for leadership in automobile tire trade is being waged by the United States, Canada and France.

The United States has maintained the supremacy it took in 1927 from France, but Canada has crowded in for second rank. The three countries, with the United Kingdom, Italy, Belgium, Germany and Japan, supply the bulk of the tire consumption of the world.

Exports of the United States in 1929, according to the department of commerce, amounted to 2,375,438 casings, the largest number shipped by any country at any time in the industry.

said the zeppelin might not be able to make the peculiar thermal and climatic conditions involved in the equatorial zones presenting unusual problems for an apparatus of its delicacy. Aside from shifting of the trade winds, which delayed the first stage of the flight to the Canary Islands and just beyond, the weather was good and the thermal problems were taken care of by allowing expansion of the lifting gas, and dropping of water ballast.

CESSATION OF MINING CAUSE OF O.-W. PLEA

SALEM, Ore., May 22 (AP)—Cessation of mining at Homestead, Baker county, two years ago, and the resultant decrease in traffic are the reasons for the application of the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation company and the Oregon Short Line to the interstate commerce commission for authority to discontinue railway operation on the line from Hoboken to Homestead, according to copies of the application received by the state public service commission.

The application states that freight traffic has dropped off to the point where rail operation is no longer justified and passenger traffic has ceased entirely. To continue operations it is claimed expensive and unjustified repairs would be necessary.

The line, which is entirely in Baker county, is owned by the O.-W. R. & N. and leased to the Oregon Shore Line.
