## FARM CHANGES DISCUSSED AT LOGAN MEETING

LOGAN, Utah, June 11 (AP)—Studies in the cost of farming are holding the interest of agricultural economists, Prof. H. D. Scudder, of Oregon Agricultural college, told representatives at the conference of the Western Farm Economics association.

He said the economists have stopped talking production to study the cost of farming operations and appeal to the farmers to make budgets, and recommended changes in types of farming and classifying lands by costs data.

"The hard place about the family farm life is being broken down," Prof. M. L. Wilson of the University of Montana, told the gathering while discussing large scale farming in the United States.

"Two of the most important forces to break it," he said, "are mechanical devices and mass production. The change in the type of country banking is also one of the greatest influences in changing the type of farming to a large scale. Banks are not interested in small farms. Lack of returns from farms for a family, great elevation in the standards of living on farms, more equality of country and city folk and other causes have tended to."

DEMOCRATS REJECT ACTION RIDICULOUS ADMINISTRATION  
PORTLAND, Ore., June 11 (AP)—Walter B. Gleason was re-elected chairman of the Multnomah county democratic committee at a meeting here. Albert Asher was named secretary, Joseph K. Carson treasurer and George F. Alexander state committeeman.

Following a peppy discussion, the committee rejected a resolution ridiculing the republican administration. Edward P. Bailey, democratic nominee for governor, was favored.

Hoover Signs Bill For Astoria Bridge  
WASHINGTON, June 11 (AP)—A bill to authorize J. C. Tenbrook, mayor of Astoria, Ore., to bridge the Columbia river at Astoria was signed Tuesday by President Hoover.

Tenbrook was authorized in the bill to construct the bridge on behalf of the city and authority was granted for the raising of tolls.

Farm Value Standard  
EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP)—Michigan State college and the Michigan Real Estate association have initiated a movement to protect the ruralist against bad investments. The real estate association will refuse to sell farm property at a price above the set standard.

WASHINGTON, June 11 (AP)—Placed at 156,698, the 4-11 club enrollment for 1929 showed an increase of 92,156 or 13.9 per cent over 1928, the largest increase in any one year in the history of the movement. Of the increase, 32,975 were boys and 59,181 were girls.

PORTLAND, Ore., June 10 (AP)—The NePage-McKenny company, with a bid of \$21,987, was the lowest of nine bidders on the contract for the habiling of Oregon caves near Grants Pass.

The bids were opened by the forestry department here. The bid will be submitted to Washington, D. C., for approval.
