C., June 12 (AP)—How to play the rolling, bottle-necked fairways, treacherous traps and tricky greens of the Shaughnessy Heights golf course on Friday the 13th, was the problem facing the 52 contestants at the start of the annual two day Pacific Northwest open golf tournament here today.

Thirty professionals and 23 amateurs—the pick of the northwest's best golf ball chasers—entered the 72-hole medal play competition this year in search of gold and golfing honors. Thirty-six holes was scheduled for today with the final 36 to be contested tomorrow.

ONE OF SEVEN CIBOLA CITIES IS DISCOVERED

PHOENIX, Ariz., June 12 (AP)—W. J. Hanna, federal farm inspector, announces the discovery of an ancient city in southern Arizona, believed by the Indians to be one of the fabled "seven cities of Cibola."

Hanna stumbled upon the ruins while roaming through the heart of a desert near the Mohawk mountains 50 miles south of Patton, Ariz.

Nearly leveled to earth the ruins are covered by the shifting sand dunes over an area six miles square. Traces of masonry and hard beaten dirt roads appear. Grinding stones and their pebbles, broken pieces of pottery are scattered about. A prehistoric water course is evident, Hanna said, and the remains of an elaborate irrigation system criss-cross it.

Legend tells that the "seven cities of Cibola" were built of gold.

BOULDER DAM EXPECTED TO ATTRACT TOURISTS

WASHINGTON (AP)—When it is completed, with a column of water 575 feet high behind it, Boulder dam will be one of the tourist wonders of the west, says the interior department.

Elephant Butte dam on the Rio Grande in New Mexico, 264 feet high, is the nearest approach to the spectacle which Boulder will present.

At Elephant Butte dam, air vents left at the bottom to relieve suction caused by the rushing waters led to a peculiar tragedy. Two workmen, passing near the grated air hole, were impaled and killed by the suction.

NORBLAD'S AGENT ACCUSED

PORTLAND, Ore., June 12 (AP)—Henry Ward, automobile dealer and bearer of a special commission from Governor Norblad, was arrested today charged with assault and battery. Mrs. George A. The transition was accomplished with publication in the official Gazette of a royal decree authorizing "her royal highness, Princess Helen, to bear the title, 'Her Majesty.'"

A new Rumanian cabinet has been formed with M. Nalau as premier. The new cabinet contains several previous ministers including George M. Mironescu.

STOCKS MOVE HIGHER TODAY IN EXCHANGE

NEW YORK, June 12 (AP)—After a fortnight of steadily declining prices, interrupted by only one rally worthy of note, bears began to lose their courage in today's stock market, and extensive short coverings set in motion a broad upturn, accelerated by hasty buying in anticipation of a substantial technical rebound.

SUDDEN LIFE INJECTED INTO HOP MARKET

PORTLAND, Ore., June 12 (AP)—Reports of possible damage to the crop from what is known as downy mildew has injected sudden life into the hop market and one result is a material advance in prices, with considerable inquiry as to production. The 1929 crop is reported as attracting bids at 12¢, while 1930 contracts are reported as 12 1/2¢ to 13¢ for clusters and as high as 15¢ for fuggles, the earlier variety.
