"We have stretched government expenditures in the budget beginning July 1 to the utmost limit of our possible receipts, and have even incurred a probable deficit principally for the relief of unemployment through expansion of public construction," Mr. Hoover said.

The president said the bill would increase expenditures for world war veterans by \$102,000,000 during the first year of its operation, with the additional expenditure totaling \$225,000,000 in later years.

Secretary Mellon said a deficit of over \$100,000,000 was in prospect for July 1, 1931, and that, if the reduced income tax rate is to be continued, present estimates forecast a deficit of \$180,000,000.

His estimates, he explained, were "predicated upon a not unhelpful attitude in respect to future business developments." But, he added, "if \$100,000,000 or more is to be added to the expenditures already in sight, it is perfectly apparent that the 1928 income tax rates must be restored" and possibly increased.

Hines objected particularly to the provisions of the bill extending from 1925 until 1930 the period in which disabilities incurred are to be presumed to have been the result of war time service.

STRIBLING HAS LEFT HAND IN PLASTER CAST

CHICAGO, June 23 (AP)—Young Stribling, no longer regarded among heavyweights as the boy with a schoolboy fighting complexion, placed his left hand into a plaster cast today and awaited developments in the leather tossing industry.

Since the "Crippled" left hand paralyzed Otto Von Porat, the Norwegian paralyzer, less than a round at the Chicago stadium Friday night, the punching Georgian has been veritably showered with offers, but has shunned them all, confidently awaiting one that will give him a shot at Max Schmelling's heavyweight crown.

His parental manager, "Pa" Stribling, has cabied Promoter Jeff Dixon in London a request for a 30-day postponement of his son's match with Phil Scott, scheduled for next month because of the "crippled" hand and, if the English heavyweights read newspapers and know what the hand did to Von Porat, the postponement is expected to be granted unhesitatingly.

Menus of The Day

By Mrs. Alexander George PINEAPPLE SHERBET IS BREAKFASTING Breakfast Menu Grapefruit Poached Eggs on Toast Papovers Coffee

Green Bean Salad, Serving 6 2 cups cooked green beans, 1 hard cooked egg, sliced, 1-2 cup diced cucumbers, 2 tablespoons finely chopped onions, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 1-2 teaspoon paprika, 1-3 cup salad dressing, Mix and chill the ingredients. Serve on lettuce.

Plum Sauce 4 cups red plums, 4 cups water, 2 cups sugar. Wash plums, add water and cook slowly in covered pan until the plums are soft. Add sugar. Boil in an open kettle 4 minutes.

Cherry Conserves 8 cups seeded red cherries, 1-2 cup orange juice, 2 tablespoons lemon juice, 7 cups sugar, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 teaspoon cloves. Mix ingredients and let stand one hour. Boil gently until the conserve becomes very thick. Pour into sterilized jars and when cold, seal.

Pineapple Sherbet (Serving 8) 1 cup sugar, 2 cups water, 1 1-2 cups finely cut or grated pineapple, 3 tablespoons lemon juice, 2 egg whites. Boil sugar and water 2 minutes. Cool. Add pineapple and lemon juice and pour into sterilized freezer. Turn crank until sherbet is half frozen. Add egg whites which have been beaten. Freeze until stiff. Remove dasher and repack freezer. Let stand for 2 hours to "ripen." Serve as dessert or with a meat or fish course at dinner or luncheon.
