Bishop Arthur J. Moore Takes Up Duties at Conference at Corvallis

CORVALLIS, Ore. (Special)—Bishop Arthur J. Moore, one of the three new bishops elected by the 1929 general conference of the Methodist church, South, will take up his official duties as a bishop of the Methodist Episcopal church, South, when he convenes the sixtieth session of the Northwest conference at Corvallis, Ore. As the first meeting of the conference for the 1929-30 quadrennium, the session will be one of significance throughout the church, and whether the conference affords the judicial council, constitutional legislation handed down by the recent general conference will be a matter of considerable interest.

College of Bishops and the committee on appeals. To become law it requires a three-fourths majority vote of the 19 annual conference into which the territory of the Southern Methodist church is divided.

The thirteenth session of the Methodist Episcopal church, South, subjects all its procedures to change at the end of a church year. In the preceding bishop's office, four years in one place is the limit of service. In the past there has been no time limit, but in any case the bishop is appointed for a single year. He may be reappointed to the same place annually.

The appointments fixing the residence of the bishop for the preceding year are made by the Bishop in charge, assisted by a cabinet composed of the presiding officers, On account of their long service, special interest at the approaching session centers around the prospective assignments of the following men who have served the same appointment four years or longer: the Rev. H. H. Hickok, Stevensville, 3 years; S. D. Walters, Corvallis, 4 years; C. J. Fisher, Corvallis, 4 years; and C. E. McDonald, Walla Walla, Washington, 3 years.

Other members who have served the Northwest conference in their present positions longer than four years are the Rev. J. A. McKee of Walla Walla, who has been conference superintendent at the Sunday school for eight years, and L. N. Hughes of Walla Walla, conference evangelist.

Bishop Moore and the cabinet of presiding officers will hold an executive session prior to the conference meeting to decide on appointments and discuss interests of Methodism under their supervision. The presiding officer are Rev. J. E. Newham of the Portland district, and Rev. J. H. Dille of the Spokane district, and both have served only one year in their present stations.

Board chairman will make reports during the meeting, showing progress of work under their supervision and accounts paid for support of church causes. Devotional addresses, reports, and other business matters will be features of the morning sessions, and committee meetings and public preaching will constitute the business of afternoon and night sessions.

In addition to Bishop Moore, who is president, other officers of the Northwest conference are: the Rev. J. H. Dille, of Spokane, Washington, secretary; E. C. Smith, Missoula, Montana, assistant; John Hagan, Willow Creek, Mont., statistical secretary; H. T. Standish, Portland, Oregon, and H. E. Hickok, Stevensville, Mont., assistants; W. H. Campbell, Walla Walla, Washington, conference treasurer; and E. E. Hagan, Willow Creek, Montana, chaplain.
