SPECIAL NOTICE
To anyone having cherry trees in Union County.

By authority of the Oregon Horticultural Laws and by order of the State Board of Horticulture you are hereby notified to spray all cherry trees on your premises (owned or leased) for the eradication of the Cherry Fruit Fly.

You are hereby notified that the correct time for the application of second spray is June 28th.

The poison spray or bait is composed of powdered lead arsenate 1/2 pound, molasses or syrup 2 quarts (never honey) and water 8 gallons. Apply the spray in fine droplets on the surface of the outer leaved at the rate of 1 pint to the tree.

A certificate will be issued to all persons spraying as directed by this order. Said certificates will give authority to sell or ship the fruit.

In the city of La Grande there will be men equipped with sprayers making a house to house canvass. Those that do not spray and comply by this order, will be compelled to do so by the inspectors appointed for each district.

Notice is hereby given that an application has been filed with the City of La Grande by Natural Gas Corporation of Oregon, a corporation, for a twenty-year franchise to construct, operate and maintain a system of conduits and pipe lines in the public streets and alleys of the entire city of La Grande, for the purpose of transmitting and distributing gas to the public for light, heat, power, fuel or any other lawful purpose, and that the attached and accompanying copies of proposed ordinance and resolution of the City Commission of La Grande are full, true and correct copies of the whole of the originals.

Any persons having any objection to such proposed franchise or any provision thereof are required to file the same in writing with the undersigned Recorder within twenty days from the first publication of this notice, which is June 28th, 1930.

RESOLUTION NO. 891, SERIES 1930
Whereas, Natural Gas Corporation of Oregon, a corporation, has filed with the City Recorder and there has been read to the Commission a proposed ordinance granting to that corporation a franchise to construct a gas system and sell gas within the city of La Grande; and

Whereas said Commission has examined said franchise, and finds and determines that it contains full and explicit statement of the various conditions required by Section 13 of Chapter 7 of the Charter of the City of La Grande, Oregon; and

Whereas said Commission is required to make an estimate of the value of what the Commission may consider fair compensation to the City of La Grande for such franchise; and

Whereas the La Grande Evening Observer is the official newspaper of the City of La Grande, Oregon;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commission of the City of La Grande:

That the proposed ordinance and franchise granting to Natural Gas Corporation of Oregon, a corporation, the right to construct, operate and sell gas within the city of La Grande, is in proper form and complies with the requirements of the Charter of the City of La Grande, and contains all the terms and conditions of the proposed grant;

That the payment by said applicant to the City of La Grande, as a condition for granting said franchise, of two per cent of the annual revenues derived after January 1, 1934, from service to the applicant's patrons within the city of La Grande, is fair compensation for the franchise;

That the City Recorder is hereby required to publish said proposed ordinance in full, once, in the La Grande Evening Observer, and also a copy of this resolution together with a notice, prepared by the Recorder, stating that an application has been made for a franchise, giving the name of the applicant, the character and location of the proposed grant, and requesting that any person having any objections to such proposed franchise or any part thereof, file same in writing with said Recorder within twenty days from the first publication of said notice;

That the first reading of said proposed ordinance is hereby fixed for the regular meeting of this Commission following the expiration of a period of twenty days from the date of publication of the Recorder's notice in said newspaper.

ORDINANCE NO. —, SERIES 1930
AN ORDINANCE granting to the Natural Gas Corporation of Oregon, a corporation, the right, privilege and franchise to lay and construct, and to thereafter operate and maintain, repair and replace, a system of conduits and pipe lines, together with such fixtures or appurtenances as the grantee, its successors or assigns, may deem necessary or convenient in connection therewith, in, under, along or across the public streets, highways and alleys or other public places in the city of La Grande, County of Union, State of Oregon, for the purpose of transmitting and distributing gas to the public for light, heat, fuel, power or any other lawful purposes, for a term of twenty years, and defining the terms and conditions of such franchise.

Section 1. There is hereby granted to Natural Gas Corporation of Oregon, a corporation, its successors and assigns, the right, privilege and franchise to lay and construct, and to thereafter operate and maintain, repair and/or replace a system of conduits and pipe lines, together with such fixtures and appurtenances as the grantee, its successors or assigns, may deem necessary or convenient in connection therewith, in, under, along or across all public streets, highways and/or alleys or other public places in the city of La Grande, County of Union, State of Oregon, for the purpose of transmitting and/or distributing gas to the public for light, heat, fuel, power or any other lawful purposes for a term of twenty years from and after the effective date of this ordinance; all such installation, if practicable, to be laid in the alleys of the city that are open.

Section 2. The system of conduits, pipe lines and other fixtures or appurtenances installed by grantee shall be laid or installed so that the top of said pipes shall be at a depth of not less than twenty (20) inches below the established or other public grade of the street, alley, parking or other public thoroughfare in said city, and otherwise in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon and the requirements and regulations of the Public Service Commission of Oregon; provided, however, that in cases where grades have not been established, such pipes shall be laid at a depth of not less than thirty (30) inches below the existing surface of such street, alley, parking or other public thoroughfare in said city, and provided further that the Commission of the said city hereby reserves to itself, the city manager or other agent, including the Public Service Commission of the State of Oregon, its agent or successors, the right to determine or establish the grade of any of the streets, alleys, or other public thoroughfares in said city, and to require the grantee of this franchise, or its assigns, to lay or re-lay any of the said pipes or other equipment laid therein, to the proper depth, so that the same, when so laid, shall conform to such grade or grades as changed or established. All pipes laid also be in conformity to the rules and regulations of the Public Service Commission of Oregon in that behalf.

Section 3. It is specially understood and agreed that the city of La Grande has already laid and will continue to lay, in the streets, alleys and thoroughfares of said city, water mains and sewer mains, and may, during the life of this franchise, desire to lay and maintain pipes and other apparatus for other municipal projects. Upon notification by the city, the grantee will change the location of its pipe lines to conform with the necessary location or relocation of the main pipe lines of the city's municipal water or sewer system or other public works, and the city of La Grande agrees, on its behalf, that in making any new location or relocation of such works, it will, so far as the public interest justifies, take into consideration the location of the grantee's system as established or plotted and filed with the city.

Section 4. It shall be lawful for, and the right is hereby granted to the said Natural Gas Corporation of Oregon, a corporation, its successors or assigns, to make all needed excavations in any of the streets or alleys of said city for the purpose of laying down, maintaining, repairing, replacing and/or operating its conduits, pipe lines or other fixtures or appurtenances installed for the purposes aforesaid.

Section 5. Whenever the said Natural Gas Corporation of Oregon, a corporation, its successors or assigns, shall disturb any of the streets, alleys, avenues, roads, highways, thoroughfares, parkings, bridges and sidewalks, or either, of said city, for the purposes aforesaid, it or they shall restore the same to good order and condition as soon as practicable and without any unnecessary delay, at the cost and expense of grantee, its successors or assigns, and on failure to do so, said city of La Grande shall have the right to fix a reasonable time within which such installation,

replacement or restoration shall be completed, not exceeding 30 days nor less than 5 days, and upon the failure of said grantee, its successors or assigns, to make such installation, replacement or restoration, said city of La Grande shall cause the same to be made at the expense of said grantee, its successors and assigns, and any expense thus incurred shall be a lien upon the property and apparatus of the said company, its successors and assigns, located within the city of La Grande, Oregon, and shall be enforced in the same manner as city liens are enforced for the grading or otherwise improving of streets; provided, however, that no excavation or part of any excavation made for the purpose of laying pipes or other apparatus or repair of same under this franchise, in the main public streets or highways shall be permitted to remain open longer than five days after the excavation is made, nor made without first notifying the city or its manager; and provided further that all excavations provided for herein shall be filled up and the streets, alleys, avenues, roads, highways, sidewalks, or either, wherein such excavation shall have been made, shall be fully and in every respect restored to their former condition.

Section 6. For the mutual convenience of the parties, and to assist the city in keeping and maintaining its record of pipes and other apparatus underground within the city limits, and in making its plans for the location, extension or relocation of any mains used by it, the grantee herein shall, prior to the commencement of the construction of its distributing system, file with the city manager a map showing the location and sizes of the pipes and mains in the several streets and thoroughfares of said city, which locations shall be at once examined and approved by the City Manager, and the map filed with the City Recorder. Such map may be for the whole city or for any district or portion thereof in which it is immediately proposed to carry on construction work.

Section 7. Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed in any way to prevent the proper authorities of the city of La Grande, Oregon, from sewer, grading, paving, planking, replacing or repairing or otherwise improving or altering any of the streets, alleys, highways or sidewalks of said city, but all such work shall be done, if practicable, so as not to obstruct, impair or prevent the free use of said pipes or other apparatus of the grantee, its successors or assigns, and the installation of the works of the grantee shall in no way obstruct, impair or prevent the free use of any underground works previously installed by any other franchise-holder.

Section 8. In consideration of the privileges and franchise granted by this ordinance, the said Natural Gas Corporation of Oregon, a corporation, its successors and assigns, shall continue and be in full force and effect for the full period of twenty (20) years from and after the taking effect, including acceptance, hereof, and are hereby granted subject to all the terms, conditions and restrictions of the charter of the city of La Grande, Union County, Oregon, now in effect, except so far as such terms may be modified or superseded by the Constitution or laws of the State of Oregon or of the United States.

Section 9. This ordinance shall be inoperative unless accepted in writing by the Mayor and filed with the City Recorder of La Grande within forty days after the passage of this Ordinance.
