### ALLISON DEFEATS WORLD'S NET KING

Henri Cochet Falls Before  
Youthful American in  
Wimbledon Today.

WIMBLEDON, England, June 30 (AP)—Wilder Allison, youthful American Davis Cup tennis player, sprang a sensational upset today by eliminating Henri Cochet, world's tennis champion, in straight sets in the quarter-finals of the British championships. Allison won at 6-4, 6-4, 6-2.

Allison's victory came like a bolt from the blue. The dazzling American ranks only seventh in singles among United States players and is considered at his best in doubles. Against the redoubtable Cochet he was expected to be lucky to take a single set.

Cochet, the defending champion, was swept off his feet by the impetuosity of the Austin, Texas, boy's attack while the gallery looked on in astonishment at the biggest upset seen here in many a day.

The Cubs have refused to be downed, and even losing the first game of their series to the Robins failed to daunt them. They came back to capture the league lead yesterday by beating Brooklyn, 5 to 1.

The Cubs now have won 11 of their last 13 games, starting when they played their last game in New York before returning home.

Brooklyn made its sad celebration of Manager Wilbert Robinson's 66th birthday by getting only seven hits off Charley Root.

# Sport Slants by ALAN J. GOULD

The next big championship joust in golf is the National Open at Interlachen, Minneapolis, July 10-12.

Among the American professionals most anxious to do something about checking Bobby Jones, the champion, will be that well known and ultra-fashionable trio—Walter Hagen, Gene Sarazen and Johnny Farrell. All three passed up the British Open in order to be thoroughly rested with and well-dressed for a renewal of their rivalry with the Georgian.

The statistics, for which many a struggling observer is thankful in hot weather, show that in the past ten years of play for the American Open, Sarazen, Hagen and Farrell each has been able to top Jones only twice. They all did it in 1927 at Oakland, taking advantage of the Georgian's worst performance in the Open.

Hagen led Jones by five strokes in 1921, when Jim Barnes spread-eagled them both to win the crown. Sarazen led the big parade in 1923 at Skokie, with Bobby only a stroke behind. Farrell beat Jones in their famous play-off at Olympia in 1928.

The rest of the record is all in favor of the rugged delegate from Atlanta. Where the so-called Big Three of the professional clan have been struggling to collect two titles among them, Jones has won three and been runner-up four times.

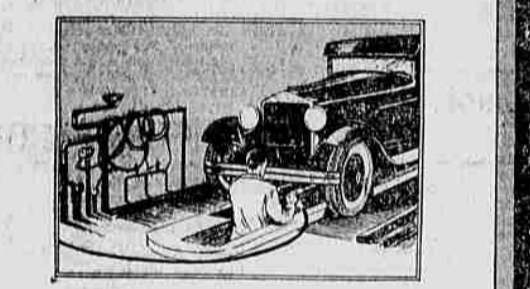
