TRENTON, N. J., July 2 (AP)—The Republican State Convention Tuesday ratified, by a 95 to 13 vote, a platform, one plank of which declared for repeal of the 18th amendment and return of liquor control to the state.

House Passes Hudson Bill
WASHINGTON, July 2 (AP)—The Hudson Bill to establish a unified border patrol, was passed Tuesday by the house, 181 to 56, and sent to the Senate.

The measure is designed to carry out one of President Hoover's recommendations to strengthen law enforcement. It would consolidate the immigration and customs service patrols under the Treasury department.

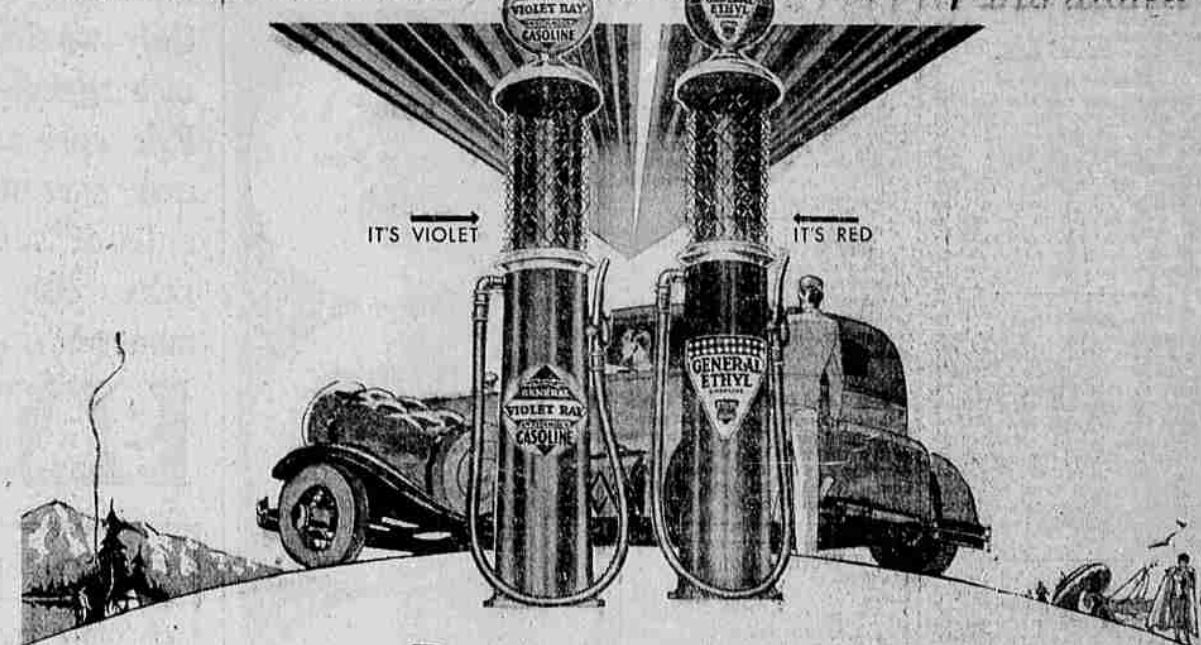
Definition Is Old

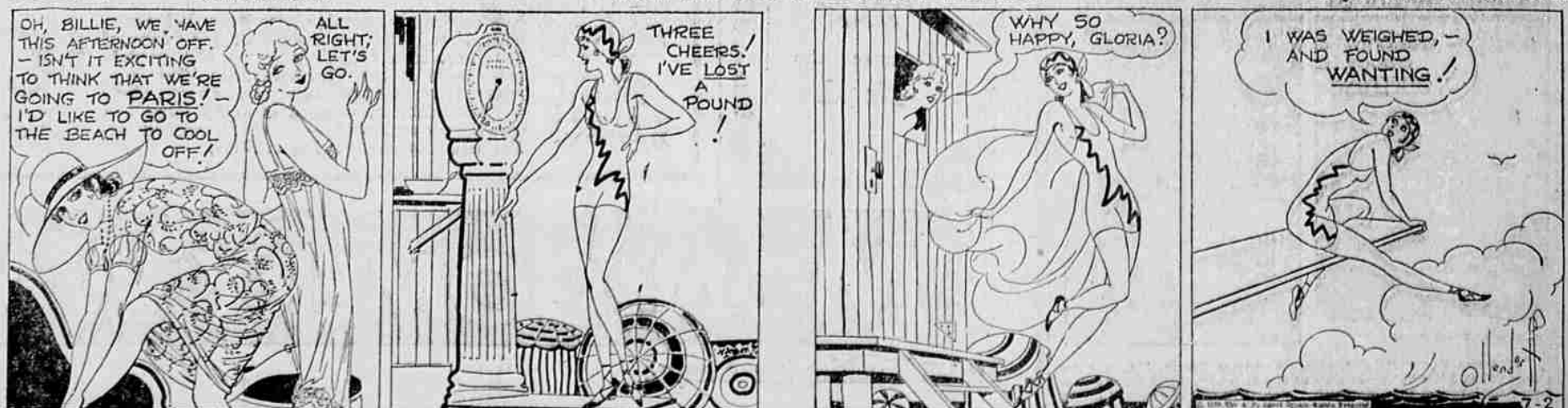
