

One Oregonian Remains In Net Tourney Today

PORTLAND, Ore., July 2 (AP)—Three Californians and one Oregonian today are to battle each other for places in the final bracket of the men's singles of the Oregon state tennis tournament.

Oregon's only hope is Bradshaw Harrison, who is to play Jack Cosgrove, San Francisco. Harrison yesterday eliminated the only other remaining Oregonian, Jack Rhine, 6-1, 6-2. Cosgrove had more trouble with his man, Ken May, winning 6-2, 4-6, 6-2.

May staged the major upset of the tournament Monday by defeating Irving Weinstein, a seeded player. After losing the first set to Cosgrove yesterday he staged a strong counter attack to win the second set but he weakened rapidly in the third. He had previously defeated Bob Hoogen, University of Oregon, in a three-set match and the two long battles had their effect.

Canadian Eliminated

The other two Californians who still were in the running today were Ray Casey and Joe Coughlan, both of San Francisco. Casey eliminated Canada's contender, J. C. Edwards, Victoria, B. C., 6-2, 6-2, while Coughlan beat Frank Cove, San Francisco, 6-3, 3-6, 6-2. The pairings today are Harrison vs. Cosgrove and Casey vs. Coughlan.

The men's doubles championship may be determined today with Harrison and Bob Hoogen playing Henry Neer and Irving Weinstein.

Mrs. Golda Myer Cross, Charlotte Miller, Helen Rosinski, and Marion Green, four seeded players, remain in the contest for the women's singles titles. Mrs. Green is to play Miss Green and Miss Miller is to meet Miss Sorenson in the semi.

Ducks Will Play Night Baseball

PORTLAND, July 2 (AP)—Thomas L. Turner, president of the Portland Baseball club, said Tuesday he had signed a contract with a Council Bluffs, Ia., concern for installation of a lighting system in the Vaughn street grounds for night baseball.

Turner said the lights would be turned on July 22 when the Portland team plays the San Francisco Mission.

Two Admitted To Citizenship By Court Decision

NEW YORK, July 2 (AP)—Declaring that an applicant for citizenship has the right to follow his conscience and religious scruple regarding the bearing of arms, the United States court of appeals has ordered that the Rev. Dr. Douglas Clyde Macintosh, professor of theology at Yale Divinity school, and Miss Marie Averil Bland be admitted to citizenship.

In its opinion the court reversed the decision of federal district courts in New York and Connecticut. Both Dr. Macintosh and Miss Bland are of Canadian birth. Dr. Macintosh was a war chaplain with the Canadian army and later served with the Y. M. C. A. with American troops in France. In his application for citizenship he declared he could not swear to bear arms in what he might consider an unjust cause.

Miss Bland, the daughter of an English clergyman, who was a war nurse with the American army, was denied citizenship in New York because she said that while she was willing to go to the front to nurse wounded, her conscience as a Christian would not permit her to bear arms.

The opinion written by Presiding Judge Martin T. Monton said that the cases of Dr. Macintosh and Miss Bland were not parallel to that of Rosika Schwimmer, who was refused citizenship because of her pacifist views. The refusal in her case was

upheld by the United States supreme court.

Judge Monton described Miss Schwimmer as an "absolute atheist" who was found to have no sense of nationalism.
