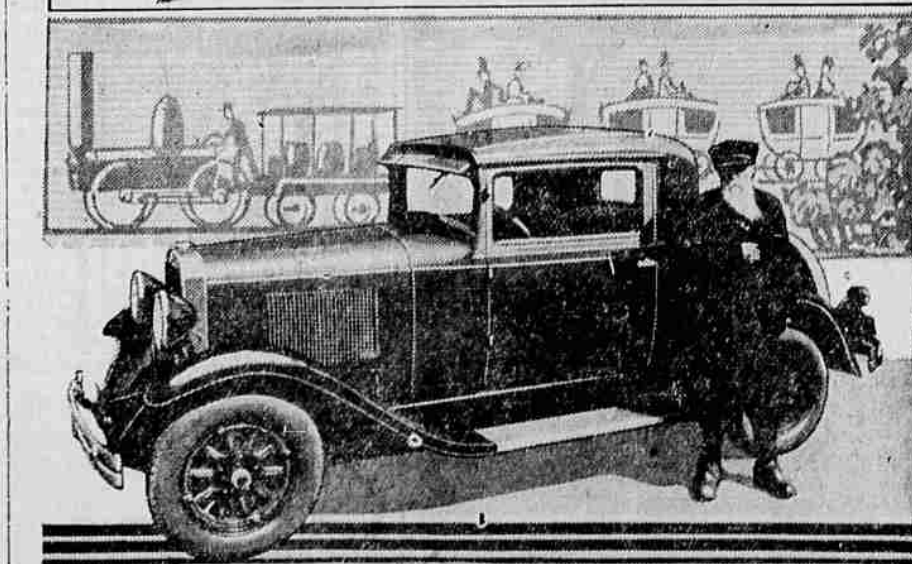
FATALLY HURT
