

SOX AND YANKEES DIVIDE 2 GAMES

Washington Loses and Philadelphia Wins to In- crease League Lead.

The Chicago White Sox may be struggling along in the second division of the American league but they still have the profitable faculty of doing the unusual at the unusual time to pep up an otherwise drab ball game. They divided a double bill with the New York Yankees yesterday.

The opener went to the Sox 10 to 7 in a long, weird affair that lasted one minute short of three hours while the Yankees took the nightcap—a tame affair compared with the first—by the score of 7 to 2 in two hours and four minutes.

Getty Hoes Twice
Lou Gehrig featured the Yankees' part in the double header, getting his twenty-second home run in the opener and his twenty-third in the second contest. Incidentally Manager Pop Shawkey found a pitcher in Charles Ruffing that could go nine innings, the Boston cast off winning the second.

The Athletics eleven innings to defeat the St. Louis Browns but they finally managed to eke out a 9 to 7 decision and increase their lead in the junior circuit two full days and coming Detroit Tigers to 4 to 1. Lefty Grove went to the rescue of Quinn, who had relieved Barnshaw, in the eighth and received credit for the victory.

Walter Johnson tried two pitchers against the Tigers but Detroit found the fat for 13 hits to make it three to one for the current series. Dale Alexander, the Tigers' big first sacker, had a gala day with his giant yth three singles and a double.

In the other American league contest the Indians made it three straight over the Red Sox, winning 3 to 2 when Wesley Ferrell bested Milton Gaston in a hurling duel. It was Ferrell's 13th victory.

Only one game was played in the National league but the Brooklyn Robins increased their lead to three games as they downed the Pirates 12 to 8. Given an early lead Dazzy Vance breezed along without much trouble behind the powerful bat of Glen Wright, who drove in seven runs, and scored four on two homers and a like number of singles. Traynor also hit for four bases.

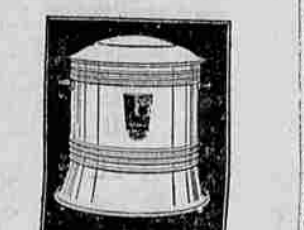

Joe Anderson Wins 8-Round Decision

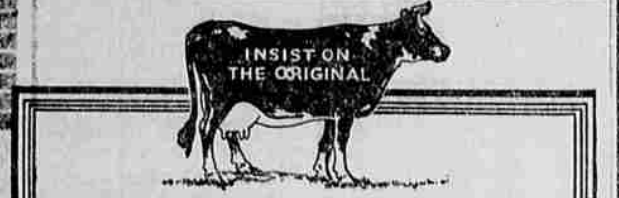

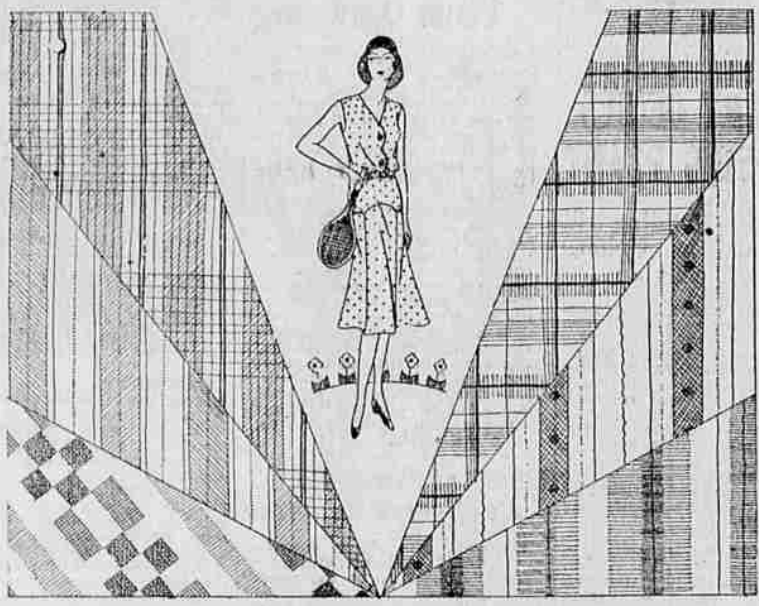
