## Drouth Worries Kentucky; Little Available Water

LOUISVILLE, Ky., July 15 (AP)—With the heat wave a thing of the past, the Kentucky public Monday went on about his business, but Kentucky farmers were troubled by a more serious matter than mercury readings.

Drouth, withering the crops so carefully tended during the spring, continued to damage tobacco, corn, wheat and other products of the Blue Grass state.

Scarcity of water for cattle also conspired to make the farmer's lot hard, and in some sections the precious fluid has to be transported long distances for the use of farm animals. Cattle were also being fed on commercial feeds, since the grass in pastures had withered, denying them their usual subsistence.

Cases of shortage of drinking water for human beings were less general, but some communities experienced that also. Prayers for rain were offered at masses in most Catholic churches, and many Protestant pastors conducted special services interceding for divine aid.

Rainfall this summer has been about half the normal quantity.

**PORTLAND**, July 16 (AP)—Mrs. Alice M. McNaught, state president of the Jackson club, democratic candidate for state representative, and life-long supporter of the labor movement, died at her home here Monday. She was at one time associated with the late Samuel F. Gompers in organization work, and was an early advocate of women's suffrage and an active proponent of public welfare measures.

## 14 Killed In Serious Riots During Strike

ALEXANDRIA, Egypt, July 16 (AP)—Fourteen persons, of whom eight were Europeans, were killed in serious rioting during a general strike Tuesday. About 250 persons were reported injured, many of them seriously. One of the dead was an Italian citizen.

**SEND REINFORCEMENTS**

**CAIRO**, Egypt, July 16 (AP)—The Exchange Telegraph company reported last night that Mohammed Ali square in Alexandria, has been occupied by a detachment of Egyptian troops and reinforcements were being rushed from Cairo.

Windows of most of the European shops fronting the square were smashed.

The crowd tried to set fire to a police station, but was driven off. One English police officer was wounded. The exact number of casualties was not estimated.

Another of many reports circulated about the city administration building was that seventeen persons had been killed and 130 injured. This report mentioned no Europeans.

Two senior police officers were known to be wounded and a large number of lower grade police and soldiers also were on the casualty list.

## Weight Question To Be Answered Thursday Night

NEW YORK, July 16 (AP)—The question of whether Sammy Mandell still can make 135 pounds without materially weakening himself will have to wait for answer until Thursday night when the lightweight king defends his title against Al Singer of the Bronx.

At Orangeburg, N. Y., where the champion is training, they announced yesterday that Sammy was under the class limit but skeptical critics took leave to doubt it. They were of the opinion that the title-holder would need two days of boiling hot to make sure that he would tip the beam at no more than 135 pounds when the boxers weigh in at the Yankee Stadium Thursday afternoon.

Two years ago before Mandell met Jimmy McLarin reports were current that the champion was having all kinds of trouble making the weight but he came in at the class limit and gave McLarin an artistic trouncing in the bargain.

Supporters of Singer base their hopes of victory on the signs they claim to see of a slink up on the champion's part. Speed is Mandell's stock in trade and if it be true that he has slowed up considerably then Singer conceivably can win. Otherwise the Bronx youngster figures to make little better showing against Mandell than did McLarin.
