GRANTS PASS, Ore., July 16 (AP)—Extensive development of chromite, copper and other deposits in Oregon was forecast here yesterday at the opening of the Mid-Pacific Empire Mineral Economic conference, attended by 200 miners and engineers. This development, the delegates were told, would result from the opening of a water transportation for Southern Oregon and Northern California through the port of Crescent City. The conference is considering mining especially in its relation to transportation.

Both Riddle children were saved.

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California Heat Is Fatal to Three

LOS ANGELES, July 17 (AP)—With three victims dead from the higher than 100 degree temperatures which have baked Southern California for the past four days, little relief was promised today. John Smith, 52, of San Diego, died in El Centro, in the Imperial valley, after having been overcome while riding in a bus. John Genarolis, of Sacramento and G. S. Lempert, Plaster City section had succumbing to 111 degree temperature near El Centro Tuesday. Yesterday's high mark was at Brawley, 112 degrees. At Calexico, on the Mexican border, where 118 degrees was recorded Tuesday, a comparatively cool breeze moved the mercury down to 101. Outside of Imperial valley, the hottest weather was at Ontario, 109 degrees. Pomona and San Bernardino registered 104.

Bullish Trend In Wall Street Trade NEW YORK, July 17 (AP)—Ambitious bullish operation were pressed forward aggressively in today's stock market, although further surges of profit taking hampered the proceedings at times. The bullish leadership displayed no impatience, confidence, although their following appeared rather nervous and not averse to deserting the cause of the first sign of difficulty. With business news still failing to show anything conclusive about the expected, or hoped for, recovery, several commission houses advised their clients to take profits and await reactions before doing further buying.

Find Skeleton of Mail Pilot (Continued from Page One) campfire and articles identified as from a kit carried by the flier three miles south of the scene of the wreckage. In addition to McDonald, the men who found the body included Jimmy Allen of Los Angeles, a cousin of the pilot. McDonald and Allen returned to Cedar City, leaving the other four men to guard the body. McDonald immediately notified the Western Air Express officials in Los Angeles of the discovery. Graham was employed by the Western Air Express on the air mail run from Los Angeles to Salt Lake City. It was on the last leg of his flight that he became lost in a storm and disappeared. His body was found on the night of January 10. Graham is survived by his widow, who lives in Hollywood, and his two children, Monte and Melodie, boy and girl twins, 8 years old. The search for Graham, who was 32 years old, began January 11 and terminated last night, was one of the most dogged in the history of aviation.
