The meteorological observatory announced the barometric pressure in the center of the typhoon stricken area had dropped to 765 millimeters (27.7 inches), one of the lowest readings ever recorded in Japan. A wireless message to Reno news agency from Fukuoka said the property loss throughout Kyushu had been very heavy. The typhoon stormed through the Loochoo islands yesterday, leaving havoc in its wake and headed toward eastern Korea and Vladivostok.

HEAVY LOSS OF LIFE
TOKYO, July 18 (AP)—The governor Nakasaki prefecture radioed a report to the home ministry today indicating there was a heavy loss of life among seafarers in the typhoon that swept lower Japan. Several boats sank in Nagasaki harbor and a number of boats were recovered after the storm passed, the governor said.

STATE TROOPER AND BLACKMAILER FIGHT TO DEATH

WOMAN SAW SHOOTING
CHICAGO, July 18 (AP)—A woman who saw Alfred Lingie, Tribune reporter, shot to death on June 9 has been found and will prove to be the state's most important witness, state's Attorney John A. Swanson announced today. The woman is recuperating, he said, from a hysterical collapse caused by the succession of accidents on the fatal day. She had been in an automobile accident a few hours before the shooting, Swanson said. On her way to a physician's office she saw a child's hand crushed in an elevator door. Leaving the doctor's office she hurried through the Illinois Central subway to take a train and saw the assassin creep up, behind Lingie, fire a bullet into his head and flee. The prosecutor said his investigators would await the witness' recovery from a nervous breakdown before questioning her. He was certain she would be a key witness.

Portland Lighting Rates to Be Cut

PORTLAND, July 18 (AP)—Reductions in residential and commercial lighting rates for the Portland area, covering Multnomah county and the Willamette valley as far south as Salem, estimated to save consumers \$340,000 a year, will be ordered by the state public service commission today, Frank J. Miller, chairman, announced here. The new rates will become effective in 30 days.

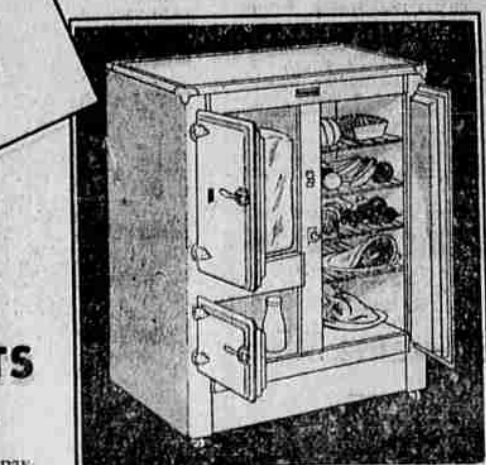
