WOOL REPORT
BOSTON, July 18 (AP)—The Commercial Bulletin will say of the wool market tomorrow: "While the volume of business in wool done during the past week has not been large it has been encouraging and has increased somewhat towards the end of the week, although not all houses have shared in the business. There is keen interest being shown in the opening of the lightweight goods by the American Woolen company Monday. It is not expected that prices will show much if any decline, certainly not more than five per cent on comparable lines. The cooperative position has been defined by the National Wool Marketing corporation as a firm one on the basis of current values, with the exception of higher prices. Foreign markets are steady. London has hardly shown any change for the week and Brisbane closed firm. Mohair is dull and unchanged."

Early Peaches
On The Market;
Berries Higher

PORTLAND, Ore., July 18 (AP)—Following its cent rise of Thursday, the butter market held steady today, with demand less brisk than previously. Top grades of eggs were firm with the demand reported good. Receipts are in fair volume.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland bureau of the U. S. department of agriculture says: "Supplies of loganberries are very light, and canners' contracts have tied up most of these; consequently, active home-canning demands have resulted in sharp price advances to \$2.00-\$2.25 per crate, compared with \$1.25-\$1.50 a few days ago. Cucumbers from The Dalles are also in light supply, and prices are up a bit, to 75c per box.

"Early Crawford peaches from California—the first free-stones of the season—are now being distributed at \$1.50-\$1.75 per box, to retailers.

"Tomatoes are steady. Fancy outdoor tomatoes from Walla Walla are topping the market by a wide margin, and are supplanting hothouse stock.

"Oregon celery is moving in considerable volume via motor-truck to nearby northwestern territory, and in carlots in limited volume. Wide distribution is being obtained on the few cars now moving, destinations ranging from Vancouver, B. C., to Alabama and Georgia. Oregon stock is selling at top market prices, in competition with eastern celery, wherever offered."

Young Witcher has made good progress in school, and was selected as Georgia's alternate representative in the Thomas A. Edison scholarship contest.

Early in life Clifford became interested in things scientific, especially radio, and has been licensed as an amateur operator for two years. He builds his own sending and receiving apparatus.

He is interested in chemistry and likes to make experiments in the laboratory. Graduating from an Atlanta preparatory school this year, he ranked high in his classes, and will enter Georgia School of Technology next fall.
