Durant Gain In Last 45 Days Is Heavy, Report

Bearing news of the sensational sales gains made by Durant during the past 45 days, Norman De Vaux, president and general manager of the Durant Motor company of California, left recently for New York City where a mid-season meeting of Durant officials will be staged next week.

"In eighteen cities and towns in Northern California we are in first place or tied for first place in the registration totals for the first ten days of July. We are second or tied for second in eight cities. We are third place or tied for third place in twelve other cities. We are second in such cities as Alameda and Fresno, and third in such important marketing centers as Berkeley, Hayward, San Leandro, Richmond, Burlingame and Pentoloma.

"In Southern California we are also making a fine showing. We are first or tied for first in five Southern California cities, second or tied for second in three cities, and third or tied for third in nine cities.

"We are tied for first in such cities as Glendora and Maywood in Southern California, second in Burbank and Ontario, and third or tied for third in Long Beach, San Pedro, Huntington Park, West Los Angeles and Ventura.

"During the first ten days of July, our dealers registered more cars than during the entire month of May, which was our best month of the year.

"Some idea of the sales volume Durant has been establishing during the past 45 days can be gained from the fact that during the month of June we registered 62 new cars in the city of Oakland alone. This was more than the total sales of our two nearest competitors, Alameda county Durant registrations totaled 94 cars for the same period.

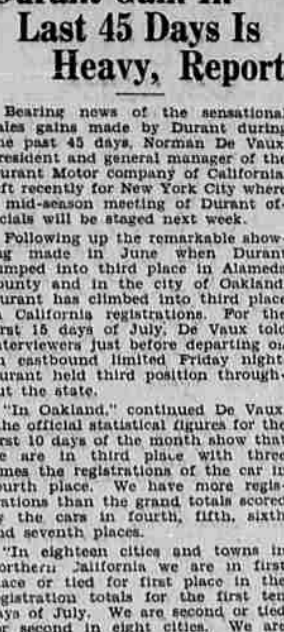
"Our great increases prove to me that the business pendulum is swinging back upward again, and that good times are rapidly returning," concluded De Vaux.

Chicken Salad Stuffed Tomatoes

Chicken Salad Stuffed Tomatoes
8 large ripe tomatoes
1 1/2 cups diced cooked chicken
1 cup diced celery
2 tablespoons chopped pimientos
1-3 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon paprika
1 cup stiff mayonnaise
Chill the ingredients. Peel tomatoes and scoop out part of insides. Mix chicken, celery, pimientos, salt, paprika and half the mayonnaise. Stuff the tomatoes. Arrange on lettuce and top with rest of mayonnaise.
Caramel Parfait
1 1/2 cups sugar
1/2 cup water
2 cups milk
3 eggs
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 teaspoons vanilla
2 cups whipped cream
Sprinkle half the sugar into frying pan, heat slowly and stir constantly until sugar has melted to a light brown syrup. Add water and boil slowly 3 minutes. Cool. Add rest of sugar, eggs well beaten and rest of ingredients. Pour into mold. Seal tightly and pack in three parts of chopped ice to one part of coarse salt. In 4 hours the parfait will be frozen.
If desired the parfait may be frozen in a refrigerator.
Mocha Cake
4 egg yolks
1 cup sugar
3 tablespoons cold left-over coffee
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup pastry flour
1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
4 egg whites, stiffly beaten
Beat egg yolks until light. Add sugar and coffee and beat 3 minutes. Fold in rest of ingredients. Pour into 2 layer cake pans which have been lined with waxed paper. Bake in slow oven 20 minutes. Cool and add frosting.
Mocha Frosting
3 tablespoons soft butter
3 tablespoons boiling left-over coffee
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 1-3 cups sifted confectioner's sugar
Mix ingredients and beat 4 minutes. Frost cake. When ready to serve cut cake in thin bars.
