## Soviet Begins Gigantic Road Building Plan

MOSCOW (AP)—Believing that Russia's communication problem can be solved only by a gigantic arterial network of low-priced roads, constructed by American skill, the Soviet government has embarked on a huge road-building campaign.  
It will involve an ultimate expenditure of \$1,250,000,000 and the laying of 5,000,000 miles of roads.  
Not only will these highways have enormous commercial importance, but they will, according to Soviet officials, bring the tens of thousands of backward and isolated villages in the remotest districts of the vast Soviet Union into closer touch with the cultural life of the cities and greatly improve the living standards of the masses.

Much of this enterprise, which will occupy five years, will be under the supervision of American road-building experts, headed by Charles F. Seabrooke, of Bridgeton, N. J., formerly Highway Commissioner of the State of New Jersey. He already has a contract with the Soviet Government to direct the laying of \$75,000,000 worth of asphalted roads in the City of Moscow.  
With Seabrooke are associated H. Eldridge Brown, professor of highway engineering New York university, and Charles Melville Upham, of Raleigh, N. C., chief engineer of the North Carolina state highway commission, who are said to have the greatest road-building experts in the United States. Assisting them are 35 other American specialists.  
To lay 5,000,000 miles of roads, as contemplated by the government, will require about \$500,000,000 worth of road-building machinery. Mr. Seabrooke expects most of this will be purchased in the United States.  
Already the government has imported about \$2,000,000 worth of road building machinery from the United States and dozens of streets in Moscow are being repaved under Mr. Seabrooke's direction. He said that 105,000 square yards of road surface had already been laid in this city and that within the next three years 900 miles of earth, gravel and low-cost roadway and 300 miles of asphalt and bituminous surface would be added to Moscow's equipment.

"No country in the world offers such road-building opportunities as Russia," said Mr. Seabrooke. "When it is recalled that the Soviet territory is three times that of the United States and that hitherto roads have not existed or been only primitive in form, some idea is gained of the magnitude of the task."

PRESIDENT OF PORTUGAL TRIES AMERICAN TRACTOR  
VILLAFRANCA DE XIRA, Portugal (AP)—The first American-made tractor was shown at an agricultural exhibition here.  
President Carmona, who is leading the "wheat campaign" which is to free Portugal of gold exports for the purchase of American wheat was at the thrashing.  
Portugal this year had a thousand farmers taking courses in scientific agriculture.  
Relief measures to farmers include a further increase of the tax on foreign wheat.

## 80,000,000 Moslems Say Gandhi's Program for India Is All Wrong

BOMBAY (AP)—Wails raised by Moslem leaders in various parts of India indicate that the 80,000,000 members of that faith have little confidence in the good intentions of their Hindu neighbors.  
In a few districts descendants of the Mohammedans who ruled the land with an iron hand until the British came, 200 years ago, have supported the Gandhi movement. But as a whole they have hesitated their leaders and held aloof from the attempt to gain immediate independence for their country.  
As viewed by the Moslems, the Gandhi campaign is aimed at destruction of both the present and former foreign rulers of India. They can not forget the centuries in which Hindus and Moslems have been bitter enemies.  
Ten years ago there was a time when Mohammedans and Hindus united against the British. But the alliance in that 1920 civil disobedience campaign was dissipated by political disagreements three years later and all attempts to renew it have failed.

There are about 220,000,000 Hindus in India and of these fully 5,000,000 are organized into the Gandhi nationalist party, making it admittedly the strongest single political force. The Gandhites made this (Swara) section represents only a minority of the Hindus themselves, since the numerous caste of the "untouchables" has been excluded from it.  
Then there are Sikhs, Indian Christians, Anglo-Indians, Europeans and other minorities and the British claim that none of them sympathizes with Gandhi and his followers in the civil disobedience campaign.  
On the other hand the nationalists assert that the Moslems are unrepentant promises that they would duly observe the Gandhian method of the property, religious, cultural and other rights of all sections of the British which would not protect the rights of all minorities. It is asserted that safeguards have already been considered for taking care of the property, religious, cultural and other rights of all sections of the teeming land.

## English Cotton Industry Faces Gravest Crisis

MANCHESTER, England (AP)—The Lancashire cotton industry, which draws most of its raw material from the southern United States and exports it as manufactured textiles to the near and far East, is face to face with the gravest crisis of its history.  
The plight of the once vast industry is revealed in a government report, drawn up after months of investigation, which tells the industry, without mincing words, that it must reorganize or get out of business.  
While trade statistics show that the world each year is using more cotton goods than before the war, Lancashire's share of the trade has declined dangerously.  
A year ago the little cotton spinning town of Burnley had only 5,261 unemployed cotton operatives. Today the figure is 15,000. The unemployed of Blackburn jumped from 7,417 last year to 27,000 today while the unemployed at Preston increased from 8,819 to 13,368.  
In 1913 the Lancashire cotton trade sold the world seven billion yards of piece goods. In 1929 it sold only 3,750,000,000 yards and this year is selling even less.

While Lancashire's sales have been reduced by half foreign competitors have been making cotton goods cheaper and just as good as Lancashire and putting them on the market more attractively. The Japanese, particularly, have almost supplanted the British in the China market and are rapidly driving the Lancashire product even out of India.  
In effect, the British government has told the Lancashire spinners that they must abandon their historic "wait - till - they - come - to - us" marketing system and adopt the American "make-the-buy" method. Also that the surviving mills must be equipped with up-to-date machines and grouped in amalgamations.

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India's capabilities for self-government, said of the differences between the Hindus and Moslems: "It is a basic opposition manifesting itself at every turn in social custom and economic competition as well as in mutual religious antipathy. Today, in spite of neighborly kindness in ordinary affairs and notwithstanding all efforts made by men of good will in both communities to promote Hindu-Moslem accord, rivalry and dissension between these two forces are one of the chief stumbling blocks in the way of a smoother and more rapid progress."

At an all-India Moslem conference in this city, Maulvi Mohammad Yakub, one of the chief Moslem leaders, said that the civil disobedience movement had been given a distinct Hindu character and that it was aimed particularly at the Moslems.

He described the Gandhi movement as "mere sham" which was "bound to retard peaceful development of the country" and under his urging a plea was launched calling upon all Moslems to present an united front for their own interests.
