He told lurid stories of his part in the war.

He said he purchased the medals from veterans who were short of cash and that after his marriage his wife carried on the tale of heroism until the affair got out of his control.

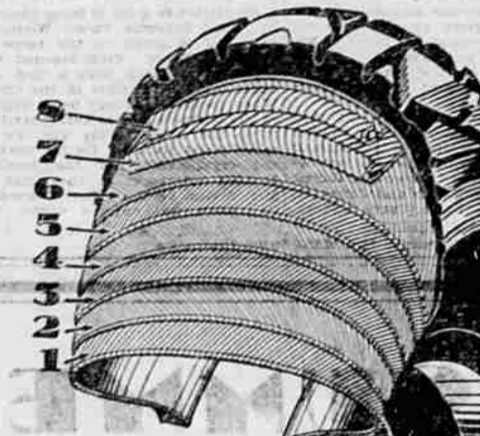
