### Prune Harvest Opened Monday In Walla Walla

WALLA WALLA, Wash., Aug. 19.—(Special)—Prune harvest opened in the Walla Walla valley yesterday. The earlier orchards are on the Oregon side of the valley and the first cars are expected to be billed from Milton and Freewater. A good quality of prune is in prospect and redoubled efforts, by the federal and state inspection service, will be put forth to keep the quality up to the standard set in recently adopted federal and state grades.  
Shippers in this district have been offering early shipments at 40 cents a suitcase and 75 cents a half bushel basket. The 40-cent price represents a gross of \$50 a ton, while the 75-cent half bushel figures about \$1 more a ton. Wire stating that a dealer in prunes with a considerable tonnage, is already quoting 35 cents, were being investigated here yesterday.

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## Prime Minister Ismet Pasha Is Favorite of The Turkish Children

ANGORA (AP)—A prime minister who is of prime importance to 10,000,000 children is Ismet Pasha, head of the Turkish cabinet and right hand man of Ghazi Mustapha Kemal.  
Angora children do not hand back from this high official, despite his reputation for military sternness. They know him not so much as a general in Turkey's war of independence, or the statesman who won Turkey's cause with the treaty of Lausanne, or as the grim economist who is now leading the country's financial battles, but as the man who gives them candy on Children's day.  
Ismet Pasha on that day reviews the parade of Angora school-children. They numbered 10,000 this year and he treated them all to sweets when they crowded to his villa to kiss his hand after the parade is over. That is the busy premier's chief annual religious duty. He greets the usual run of society visitors and so does his quiet, pretty young wife whose name almost never appears in the Turkish press except in connection with charities such as the Turkish Society for the Protection of Children.  
When an association of American mothers a few years ago asked Turkey to choose the model Turkish mother, Madame Ismet Pasha was unanimously elected. If a model father were to be asked for Turkey might well choose her husband.  
Whatever time he can spare from state affairs, he devotes to his three little boys. His favorite recreations, billiards and horseback riding, he shares with his oldest son, 8-year-old Omar.  
When political discussions were long between the premier and government officials who drop in at the Pasha's modest villa, young Omar breaks in with a "leave politics alone, father, and let's about some billiards," and the premier whom all Turkey obeys, obeys his son.  
"They listen in together at the father whenever the boys can pretend their father to lay aside the French and German books on economics which he reads by the dozens, and
