Lon Chaney, Man Of A Thousand Faces, Is Dead

Mysterious Star of the Screen Succumbs Sudden-ly to Anemia and Lung Congestion.

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 26 (AP)—Lon Chaney, 47, "The Man of a Thousand Faces," died at St. Vincent's hospital here today after a valiant battle against anemia and a congestion of the bronchial tubes.

A hemorrhage of the lungs suffered sharply after mid- night suddenly cut short the veteran actor's fight for life after he had been reported on the road to recovery last night.

Lon Chaney readily re- sponded to treat- ment and last week three blood transfusions were resorted to.

Lon Chaney, who died at 12:58 a. m., was 47 years old. At Chaney's bedside when he died was Mrs. Chaney, a constant attend- ant since her husband first was taken ill, and Gretchen Chaney, a son by a former marriage.

The death of Lon Chaney removes from Hollywood's varied ranks a ver- itable mystery man. Known almost en- tirely by his screen appearances, away from the motion picture Lon Chaney inevitably wore a pulled down cap, dark glasses and a plain white coat.

CURTIS REYNOLDS AIRPORT, Chicago, Aug. 26 (AP)—Mrs. Omlie, pioneer woman flier, streaked across the field at the national air races today at 3:17 p. m. to win the women class B Dixie derby from Washington, D. GERMAN FLIERS IN GOTHAM NEW YORK, Aug. 26 (AP)—The Ger- man seaplane piloted by Captain Wolfgang Von Gronau and his three companions, landed in New York harbor at 2:45 p. m. (E. S. T.) today from Halifax, concluding a flight from Germany.

The German crew brought their big Dornier Walh from Halifax to a small landing in the water besides the Statue of Liberty in six hours to the minute.

Flying low and fast and hugging the Atlantic coast line over the New England states they made a rate of speed which surprised the throng gathered at the battery awaiting their arrival here.

The airline distance from Halifax to New York is 1,200 miles. Their route was something longer because they fol- lowed the short line—about 800 miles, and their average speed had been a hundred miles an hour or better.

HEAVYWEIGHT DIES AFTER PRIZE FIGHT

Frankie Campbell Succumbs From Effects of Beating Last Night.

MAX BAER FACES POLICE ACTION

Will be Charged with Man- slaughter — Fighter's Wife Forgives Baer for Fatal Blows.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 26 (AP)—Frankie Campbell, 26, San Francisco heavyweight boxer, died in a hospital here today from effects of a beating received in a ten-round bout last night with Max Baer, of Liverpool.

The boxer died at 11:45 a. m. after being unconscious more than 13 hours.

Campbell had been suffering from a general cerebral hemorrhage and two operations had been performed in an effort to relieve the pressure on the boxer's brain.

Chief of Police William Quinn said Baer would be charged with man- slaughter.

Second fatality in week.
Campbell's death was the second ring fatality in a week here. Johnny Anderson died from injuries received in a bout here with "Red" Kendl last Wednesday.

A short time before the fighter died his wife Mrs. Elsie Campbell, forgave Baer for the blows that re- sulted in death.

Baer said: "It was unfortunate, I'm sorry." "It even might have been you, mightn't it," she replied.

CANADA OP'S AGAINST U. S. FRUIT DUMPING

OTTAWA, Aug. 26 (AP)—E. B. Ryckman, minister of national revenue, today took action against dumping of certain American fruits and vegetables in Canada. He announced a set of values for duty of certain produce imported from the United States.

Following are the values per pound: Apples 6 cents; cabbages 10 cents; cantaloupes 13 cents; celery 10 cents; onions 4 cents; peaches 12 cents; pears 9 cents; plums and prunes 8 cents; tomatoes 10 cents.

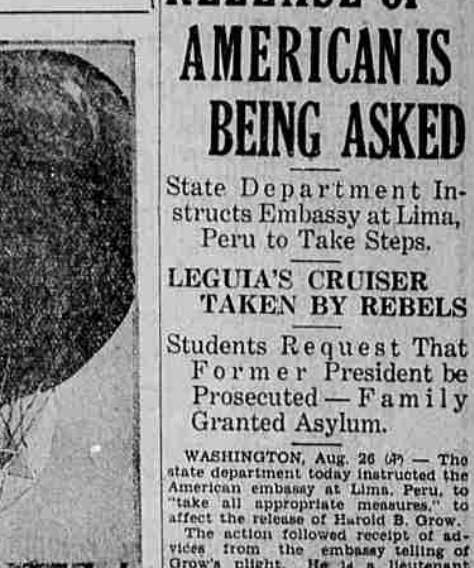
