CHICAGO, Aug. 28 (AP)—George Dickson, a Pittsburgh aviator attending the National air races, was arrested yesterday on the complaint of a restaurant manager that he had discharged a tear gas gun forcing all of the cafe's guests to flee to the street. Fred Bethke, manager of Henrick's, told police Dickson came into the restaurant shortly after midnight and became angered when Bethke told him that the cafe was closed. The manager said Dickson pointed out the fact that others were still eating. Bethke said he told the aviator and others had all entered the cafe before the closing time but Dickson still resented not being given a table and he then discharged a small tear gas gun which quickly emptied the place.

SALEM, Ore., Aug. 28 (AP)—The federal government could do much to eliminate forest fire hazards in Oregon, and at the same time do a great deal to relieve the unemployment situation by the construction of needed forest trails, said C. H. Gram, state labor commissioner. He said he believed not over \$500,000 would be necessary for the work. Gram said he would place the matter before the state federation of labor and other organizations and also the Oregon delegation in congress.

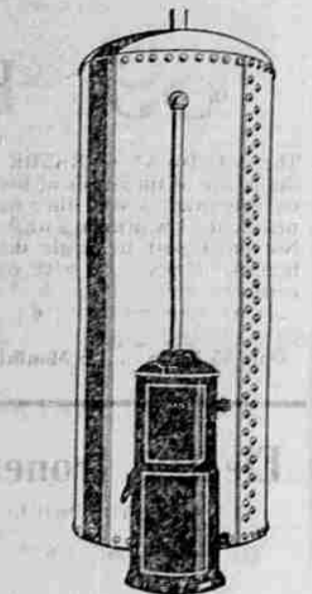

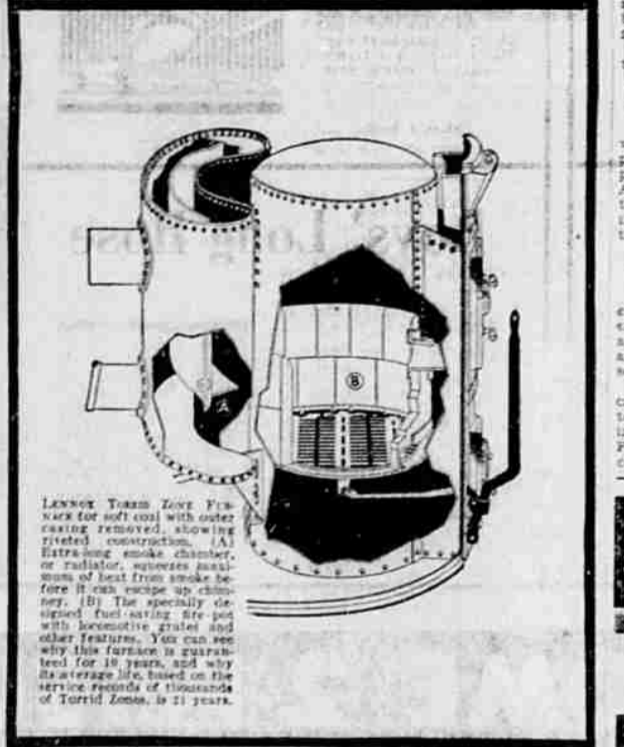
