vestation of the city last month, they expelled the governor a few days ago. Without proper leadership they feared red revenge for the hundreds of military executions of communists following the July red assassinations and lootings.

Scores of commandeered boats were in the river to bear provincial troops away if the red attack proved too strong.

Three thousand Chinese refugees from Changsha reached Hankow today and more were coming.

Thousands of others fled from Wuchang, across the Yangtze river to Hankow. Red forces were reported preparing to attack the city of a half million population.

Justo Suarez, Argentine lightweight champion, spoke via radio to the South American country, after he knocked out Bruce Flowers, negro lightweight, in New York.

have sufficient funds available to meet its share of the work, but hesitated to pass up the opportunity to work done, or delay it by lack of funds.

About \$300,000 will be turned over to the county in a period of four years from license revenue, it was said.

RELISH RECIPES FOR WINTER Menu for Dinner

Baked Fish Baked Potatoes  
Escalloped Onions  
Currant Jam  
Head Lettuce and Relish Dressing  
Sultana Loaf Cake Mocha Frosting  
Coffee

Sultana Loaf Cake  
1/2 cup butter.  
1 1/2 cups light brown sugar.  
1 egg.  
1 cup raisins.  
1 teaspoon allspice.  
1 teaspoon cloves.  
1 teaspoon cinnamon.  
1/2 teaspoon salt.  
1 teaspoon vanilla.  
1 cup sour milk.  
2 1/2 cups flour.  
1 teaspoon soda.  
Cream fat and sugar. Add other ingredients. Beat 2 minutes. Pour in 2 loaf cake pans fitted with waxed papers. Bake 35 minutes in moderately slow oven. Cool and frost.

RELISHES  
Oil Pickles  
50 cucumbers (6 inches).  
5 tablespoons salt.  
Cold water to cover.  
3 cups peeled white onions (1 inch in diameter).  
1 green pepper sliced.  
2 tablespoons yellow mustard seed.  
2 tablespoons white mustard seed.  
1 tablespoon celery seed.  
1 teaspoon black pepper.  
1/2 teaspoon powdered alum.  
1 cup olive oil.  
2 cups vinegar.  
Wipe off cucumbers with damp cloth. Cut in 1/2 inch slices crossways. Sprinkle with salt and cover with cold water and let stand 6 hours. Drain and cover with boiling water.
