CUBS HAVE FOUR GAME ADVANTAGE

Cardinals Move Into Third Place by Winning Double Header

Labor day efforts having failed to do much in the way of settling the National league pennant problem, the senior circuit swings into the first month of the 1930 season with the Chicago Cubs holding a four-game lead over the Giants in second place but with the Cardinals looming as the most serious threat only a half-game further back in third position.

St. Louis was the only one of the four leaders to win a doubleheader yesterday, the Giants and Robins breaking even and the Cubs dropping both of their encounters.

Cards Win Double Bill
In moving ahead of the Robins, the Cards walloped the Pittsburgh Pirates 11 to 6 in the morning and then repeated with 5 to 1 trimming in the afternoon.

Red Lucas and Benny Frey set the champions down with five blows. The Cubs had the second game won 1 to 0 with two out in the ninth.

Giants Lose Nightcap

The Giants were cracking the ball at a terrific clip, getting 27 hits in two games but they lost the nightcap to the Phillies 4 to 3 after taking the opener 5 to 4.

Wally Berger's thirty-second home run was instrumental in dropping the Robins into fourth place, the circuit drive accounting for three of the Braves' runs that beat the Robins 5 to 3 in the first game.

A's, Yankees Break Even

While lacking much of the color in the National league race, the Philadelphia Athletics and New York Yankees drew a crowd of 72,000 into the Yankee stadium to see an even split in the feature games of the American league. The world champions took the opener, 3 to 2 because of Al Simmons' thirty-second home run but Charlie Ruffing set them down with two hits to give the Yanks a 2 to 0 victory in the second.

The Senators cut the A's lead to five and one-half games by taking the Boston Red Sox into camp twice, 2 to 1 and 6 to 3.

Wesley Ferrell won his twenty-fourth victory of the season and his thirteenth in a row as the Cleveland Indians downed the St. Louis Browns 13 to 8 and 9 to 5.

White Sox Beaten

The Chicago White Sox were the victims of Detroit's wrath, the Tigers taking both ends of the holiday bill, 6 to 5 and 4 to 2. Earl Whitehill got his fifteenth victory of the year in the second.

Portland Wins Series 6 to 2; Stars Clean Up

The Hollywood Stars had a firm grip on the Pacific Coast league lead today because of their double win yesterday over the Francisco Missions. The Stars took the first, 15 to 4, and the second, 6 to 2, coming from behind to rout Jack Knott, who pitched perfect ball during the early part of the game.

The Seals and Angels divided their double-header in San Francisco yesterday, San Francisco winning the first, 9 to 1, and Los Angeles the second, 5 to 1. Jimmy Zinn and Ed Baecht were the star laborers on the mound. The Angels remained in second place, three and a half games ahead of the Seals.

Ducks Divide Bill

Portland, although dividing with Sacramento, has moved up to fourth place in the league, being only two games behind the Seals. The Ducks dropped the opener, 11 to 8, to the Senators, but came back to win the final round, 5 to 1, yesterday, and win the series 6 to 2.

Seattle, after losing consistently for several weeks, made a 7 to 2 series win over the Oaks. The Indians also divided yesterday, losing 6 to 2 to Oakland in the first game, and winning 6 to 4 in the second. Although still at the bottom, Seattle is now only one game behind Sacramento and half a game behind the Oaks.

Joe McCarthy can be cheered for some heroic infield juggling if his Cubs repeat in the National league flag hunt. When the Bruins hitched their belts for the final month's drive, there was only one survivor of the 1929 inner quartet on the job—Woody English—and he was shifted from shortstop to third base to make the shakeup complete.

Long George Kelly was recalled to take the place of First Baseman Charlie Grimm, injured in the thick of the fight for the second straight year; Clarence Blair held down second base instead of Rogers Hornsby; and the Birmingham dentist, Dr. Eddie Farrell, bobbed up at shortstop, with Clyde Beck around for reserve duty.

In fact, with Dan Taylor subbing in the outfield for Riggs Stephenson and Gabby Hartnett doing the regular backstopping again in place of Zack Taylor, the Cubs bear little resemblance on the field to the team that finished on top last year.
