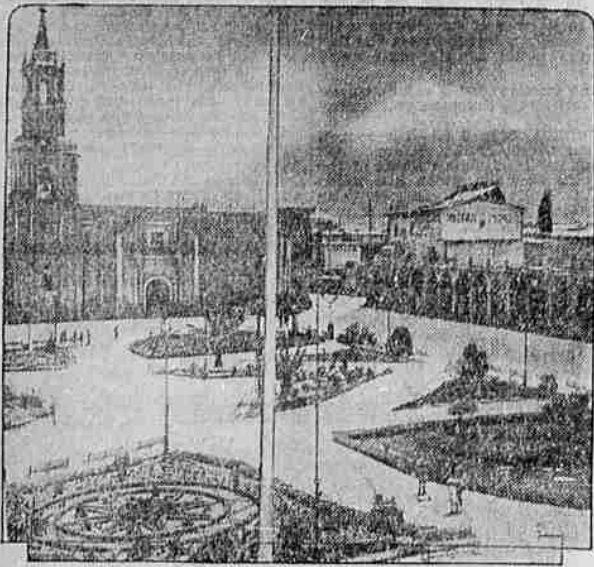

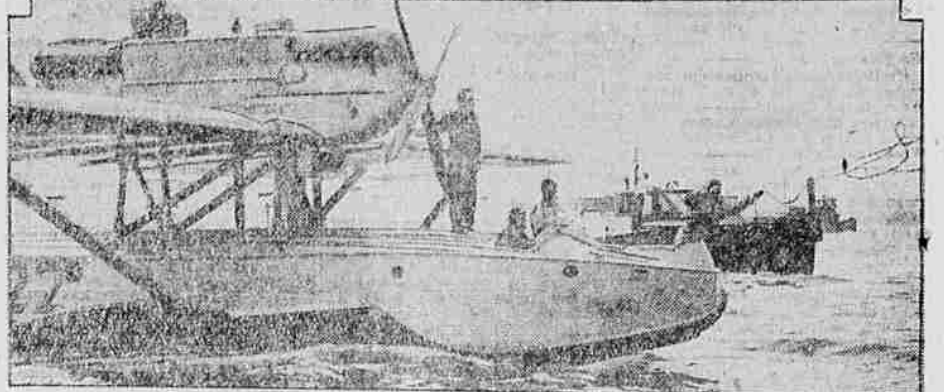


LINDBERGH WATCHES OTHER BIRDS
