RADIO CHAINS TRY TO OUTDO EACH OTHER

Rivalry between the country's two nation-wide broadcast networks certainly is intense.

Each tries to outdo the other in the way of special features, and as a result the listener gets a special treat that might not otherwise have been developed.

A few hours after its announcement this competition is valuable otherwise as it means that neither the NBC nor the CBS network can let down an iota without the other leaping in to gather whatever laurels that might accrue.

One of the most recent demonstrations of the rivalry was the preliminary to the broadcast by Premier Benito Mussolini of Italy from Rome. Just what actually happened behind the scenes has not been revealed, but the pronounced ripples on the surface gave a hint of considerable activity somewhere along the line from Rome to New York.

The NBC chain had announced that it had completed plans for the broadcast about a week before it went on. Later CBS advised that it would participate also.

A few hours after its announcement CBS reported that "facilities were withheld from us, making it impossible for us to share in the broadcast."

Between those two announcements there must have been some rather strenuous goings-on in the headquarters of both networks. There's little doubt that cablegrams were an important factor as were numerous telephone conversations.

A few hours after reports have begun to come from various sections of the world advising of good reception of the talk which was retransmitted by several short-wave stations in the country.

The reception was quality-high all during the time it Duze was talking and for the musical program after his speech. Engineers say this was due to a combination of excellent atmospheric conditions and the quality of the equipment at 3RO, Rome, which sent the signals to America on 25.4 meters.

Kenneth G. Harlan, Portland rate engineer, said government construction of a dam and power plant on the Columbia river without provision for power lines would be like "building an automobile and not putting wheels on it."

Several other members of the committee indicated they favored the amendment.

Senator Steiwer also suggested an amendment providing for elasticity as to the precise location and height of the dam, to avoid conflict with the army engineers' report expected June 30.

BREAD PRICES, SUGAR TO BE INVESTIGATED

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16 (AP)—The senate today adopted a resolution for investigation of the reasons for the failure of the price of bread to reflect the decline in the price of wheat and flour.

Inquiry will be made to ascertain whether bread prices are at their present level because of "combination in restraint of trade."

The senate interstate commerce committee was given \$15,000 from the senate's contingent fund for the study.

The study concerning sugar prices will be conducted simultaneously with that into bread prices.

BOSTON, Jan. 16 (AP)—The Commercial Bulletin will announce: "There has been rather more business in wool and more inquiry. Prices have rather favored the buyer. Demand chiefly favors the finer wools still. More interest is shown in medium wools at lower prices."

"Foreign markets have been more active, with exchange rates carrying over a premium in favor of the exporters from the primary markets. Prices are lower again at the river plant. Europe is waiting for the London opening January 28th."

"Reports from the piecergoods market indicate a liquid condition. When manufacturers require wool they frequently want quick deliveries."

"Small inquiry for mohair is reported. Prices show no change from recent quotations."

The bulletin will publish the following quotations (London):

Soured basis: Oregon—Fine and f. m. staple 67-88; fine and f. m. combing 60-63; fine and f. m. clothing 68-69; valley No. 1, 55-60.

Mohair: Oregon—38-40; domestic grading, first combing 50-52; good carding 34-36.

NEW YORK, Jan. 16 (AP)—The stock market closed with a firm tone today with numerous advances of one to three points. Trading however, was sluggish, the day's sales aggregating only 1,350,000 shares. Such issues as American Telephone, Atchafson, Westinghouse and Allied Chemical advanced 2 to 3 points, while U. S. Steel, American Can, General Electric and North American rose a point or more. Bethlehem Steel dropped two and recovered only partly.
