GEORGE DEFENDS WRESTLING TITLE

Defeats Henri de Glane, French Mat Giant, in Los Angeles Match

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 22 (AP)—Taking the first and only fall of the match, Ed Don George successfully defended his newly acquired claim to the heavyweight wrestling championship of the world last night when he vanquished Henri de Glane, French mat giant.

After 21 minutes and 7 seconds of fast and furious wrestling the former University of Michigan athletic star who recently defeated Gus Sonnenberg for the title claim pinned the Frenchman's shoulders to the mat with a body hook and half nelson.

During the brief but hectic struggle De Glane suffered a fractured shoulder and was unable to continue, losing the match by default.

In the semi-final Joe Malcewicz and Fred Meyers wrestled one hour to a draw. Steve Strelch defeated Chief Mohawk in a one-fall opening match.

THYRE PINS CANTONWINE
PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 22 (AP)—Ted Thye, Portland heavyweight wrestler, defeated Howard Cantonwine, lower, two out of three falls here last night. Cantonwine suffered an injury to his shoulder when Thye threw him into the orchestra pit with a wristlock in the second fall, rendering him practically helpless.

Cantonwine won the first fall in 10 minutes with a series of headlocks. Thye took the second in 27 minutes and the third in 4 minutes, using wristlocks to gain both falls.

Chet Wiles took one fall in the second round from Joe Ferguson, boxer-wrestler to win, and Pete Axtman and Sammy Vangler, went three rounds to a draw in the preliminaries.

Legislature Gets Appropriation Bill

SALEM, Jan. 22 (AP)—The first major appropriation bill was introduced into the house yesterday by the joint ways and means committee, asking appropriations in excess of \$475,000 for deficiency payments. The measure included \$250,656.50 for payment of penitentiary tax accounts, \$39,693.37 for circuit judges salaries and circuit court expense and \$31,066.64 for support of homeless children.

Completion of an additional wing at the state penitentiary to cost \$23,000, now under construction under the direction of the state board of control and the payment of claims incurred by the board in the construction authorized by the emergency board April 4, 1930, were the contents of bills introduced in the house, sponsored by the joint house and senate ways and means committee and carries the emergency clause.

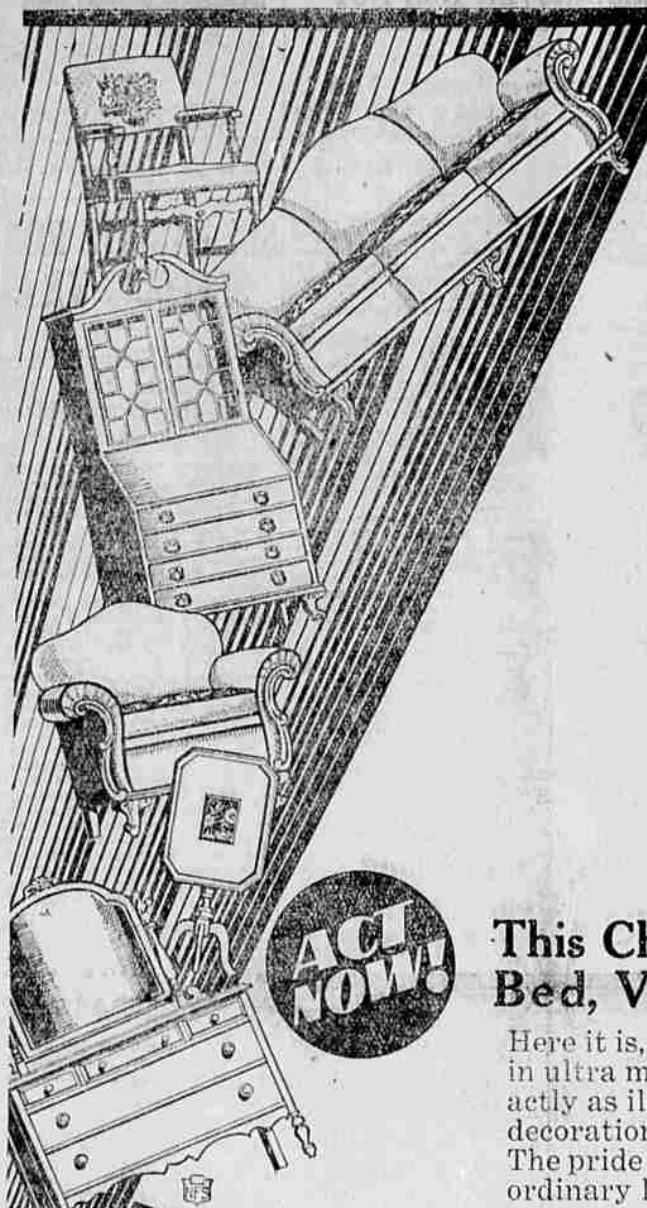

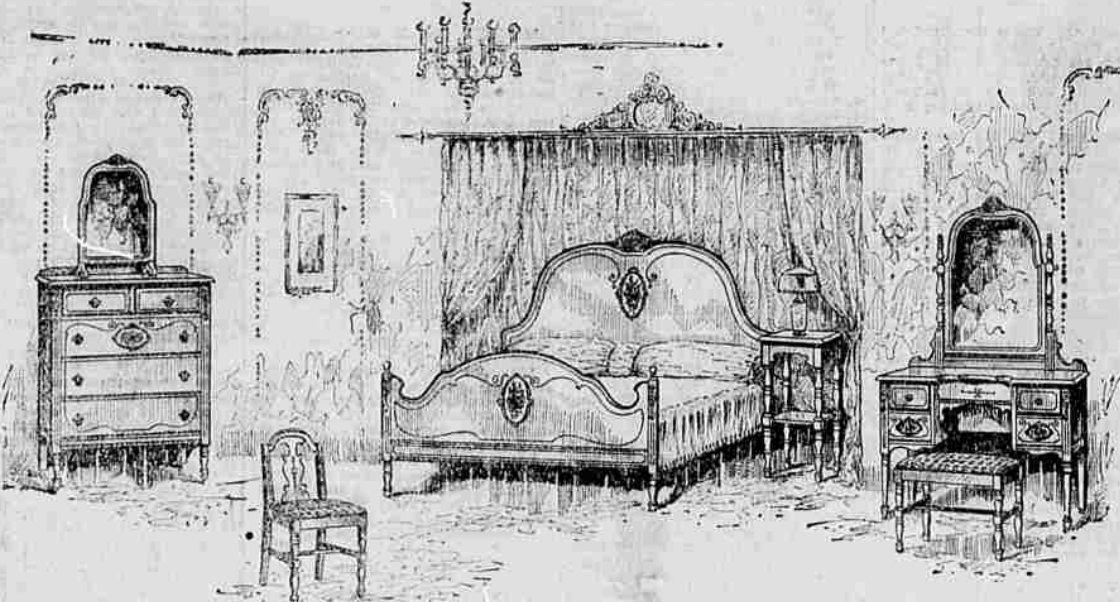
