**LIVERPOOL, Eng., Jan. 23 (AP)** — Top weight of 175 pounds in the grand national steeplechase has been assigned to Easter Hero, owned by the American-John Hay Whitney. The grand national will be run over the famous Aintree course March 27. Easter Hero will carry two pounds more than D. B. Davis' Gib which gets in with 173 pounds. Shaun Gollin, winner of the race last year, has been assigned 172 pounds. Other weight assignments were: Gregalach, 1929 winner, and East Galawat, 168; Sir Lindsay, second Whitney entry and third in last year's race, 160.

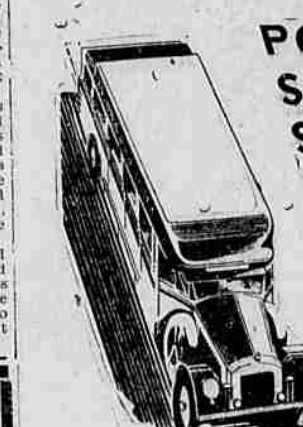
## Takes Bride, Wins Fight in Same Ring

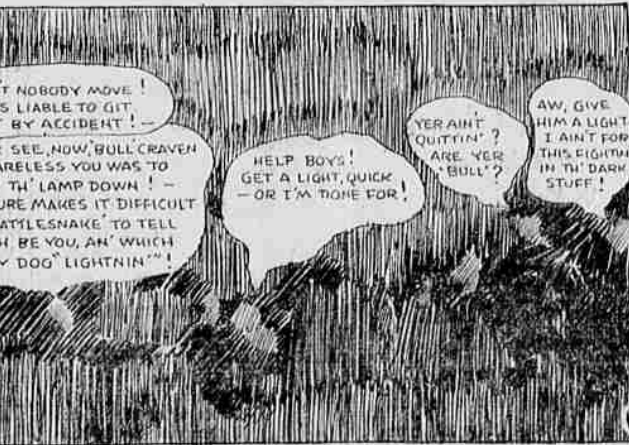

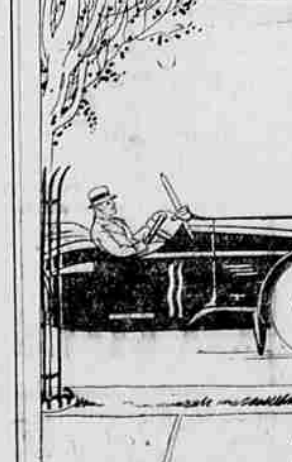
