DISABLED COME FIRST

Should congress refuse to overrule the president and the secretary of the treasury, who are opposed to paying the veterans' adjusted compensation in full and immediately as an unemployment relief measure, the veterans agitating such payment will know that their efforts were not without some fruits.

Discussion of the compensation question has accentuated the urgent need for expansion of veterans' hospitalization facilities and disclosed that legislation providing for such expansion is clogged in the house of representatives and in danger of being held over until the next session.

The government may not be in a financial position to immediately convert the soldiers' insurance into cash and provide adequate hospitals for disabled veterans at the same time, but it can do either one or the other and is morally bound to do that at once.

With commendable unselfishness the rank and file of World war veterans place the needs of the disabled before their own requirements. Even the unemployed say that care of the disabled must come first. The immediate result has been that the senate has pledged itself to immediate consideration of the hospital program and to adequate legislation before March 1.

A hospital expansion program of sufficient proportions might accomplish two desirable results at one time. If the work is given to unemployed veterans, it will bring relief to both the unemployed and the disabled.

CELEBRITIES IN THE FLESH

In Washington

WASHINGTON—Senator Morrow of New Jersey is rapidly convincing Washington, especially those observers on capital hill, that he is really a very modest and retiring sort of individual.

On the day he first entered the senate newspaper men swarmed around him only to be met with the quiet statement that he would listen to whatever they had to say, but he would say nothing. And he didn't.

And now it has gone a step further. The biography which he supplied the Congressional Directory—that bible of official Washington—will convince even the most confirmed skeptic that Morrow really likes to keep himself in the background.

Next to Senator Blaine of South Carolina, whose biography reaches more than four and one-half inches, comes that of Senator Davis.

Income Tax Facts No. 1 If husband and wife should each have a net income in excess of \$4,000, but neither a net income in excess of \$8,000, it is to their interest, in filing separate income tax returns for the year 1930, to divide the personal exemption of \$3,500 between them, as shown by the following illustration.

Total for husband and wife. 150 The normal tax rate being 1 1/2 per cent on the first \$4,000 of net income in excess of the personal exemption and other credits, 3 per cent on the next \$4,000, and 5 per cent on the balance, any other division of the personal exemption would have subjected part of the husband's or wife's income to the 3 per cent rate.
