1/4 teaspoon paprika.  
2 tablespoons chopped onions.  
1/2 cup chopped celery.  
1 tablespoon chopped green peppers.  
2 cups tomatoes.

Escalloped Turnips  
3 cups sliced, cooked turnips.  
4 tablespoons butter.  
6 tablespoons flour.  
1 teaspoon salt.  
2 1/2 cups milk.  
1/4 teaspoon paprika.  
1 cup cheese, cut fine.  
1/2 cup cracker crumbs.  
Melt butter and add flour, salt and paprika. Add milk and cook until creamy sauce forms. Stir constantly. Add turnips. Pour into shallow, buttered baking dish. Mix cheese and crumbs. Sprinkle over top. Bake 20 minutes in moderate oven. Serve in dish in which baked.
