Spring Modes Not Dull, But Dull Colors May Rule

PARIS (AP)—Plain colors for pretty faces is an advance Parisian rule on springtime frocks.

Although many and varied figures and plaids will brighten the vernal array, a number of Parisian stylists predict plain dull-colored frocks will be a heavy favorite for spring.

Not that the springtime mode promises to be a somber one—far from it. There is many a figured silk patterned in tiny figures or shadow plaid, while flowered chiffons also are making a heavy bid for popularity.

There is much talk of plaids, particularly those of the Scottish variety, which many stylists declare will be used to fashion simple, one-piece dresses worn with short plain-colored coats.

Wools, fashioning one-piece dresses, suits and coats, are seen in great variety. Spongy, soft, pebbly wools, open-work weaves suggestive of wool lace and light-weight tweed mixtures are among the most popular.

Many of the wools are monotonous, while a number of simple patterns and suggested plaids and stripes also are seen.

to the rough topography of the surrounding country the only view of any appreciable extent can be had from the Oregon side. This locality has no improved roads at present.

1 cup diced celery 2 hard cooked eggs, diced 2 tablespoons chopped pimientos 1 tablespoon finely chopped onions 2 tablespoons chopped sweet pickles 1/4 teaspoon paprika 2-3 cup salad dressing

Mix half of dressing with rest of ingredients. Chill. Serve on lettuce. Top with remaining dressing. Serve at once.

Valencia Cake 1-3 cup fat 1 cup sugar 2 egg yolks 1/4 teaspoon salt 1/4 teaspoon salt 2-3 cup orange juice 1 tablespoon lemon juice 2 cups pastry flour 2 teaspoons baking powder 2 egg whites, beaten Cream fat and sugar. Add yolks, salt, fruit juices, flour and baking powder. Beat two minutes. Fold in egg whites. Pour into two layer cake pans lined with waxed paper. Bake 20 minutes in moderate oven. Cool and add filling.

Filling 4 tablespoons sugar

2 tablespoons flour 1/4 teaspoon salt 1 egg yolk 1/2 cup orange juice 2 tablespoons grated orange rind 1/2 teaspoon lemon juice 1 tablespoon butter Blend sugar, flour and salt. Add rest of ingredients. Cook slowly and stir constantly until thick sauce forms. Beat one minute. Cool and use as filling between cake layers. Cover with frosting.

Frosting 1 egg white, beaten 2 tablespoons butter, melted 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/4 cup orange juice 1/4 cup sifted confectioner's sugar 1/2 cup coconut Beat egg white, add sugar, butter, salt and juice. Beat until thick and creamy. Frost top and sides of cake. Sprinkle with coconut.
