COMMISSION TURNS DOWN PETITIONERS

An ordinance stating that a person can't engage in paper hanging, painting or decorating without a license, the fee for which is stated as \$10, or a \$1000 bond, was read twice and held until next week for the final reading and the vote. If a painter, paper hanger, or decorator is working for a licensed person, firm or corporation he will not be required to have a personal license.

The ordinance as read does not apply to working on one's own property, but when a fee for services is charged, and a license has been secured by the painter, paper hanger, or decorator, a fine of from \$10 to \$50 or a jail sentence not to exceed 10 days may be assessed according to the ordinance which will come up before the commission for the final vote next Wednesday.

A total of \$2,619.77 was voted to Clyde R. Seitz for the completed portion of work in improvement district 198, 199, and 200; and the January bill amounting to \$14,266.96 more or less, were allowed. Bonds for J. E. Stearns, recorder-treasurer, and L. B. Rice, assessor, are to be placed in a local bank in return for which the bank will issue a receipt.

Overhaul Pump
The pump was overhauled and repaired by the firemen at a cost of about \$100 for material, saving the city many dollars in labor. Mr. Cherry reported to the commission. The pump bill for pumping water for the month of January was reduced \$177.50 over the previous month, his report said.

No more horse shoe games while on duty is the order which the city manager reports he has given the chief of police and the employees. He also instructed the chief of the fire department to delegate one man to be on duty daily in the fire station at all times, while the other members may play horse shoes so long as they are in the immediate vicinity of the fire station.

A weekly report will be made by City Manager Cherry, showing the exact amount of cash Mr. Stearns started with at the first of the month and the weekly cash receipts and disbursements, with the exact amount of cash on hand and where it is. In the following report the \$14,771.73 from Mrs. Fowler has been collected from the bank where it was in her name as city treasurer, and various other sources, but does not affect the shortage of \$112,252.02, Mr. Stearns states.

TRAFFIC LAWS

Attention of the public is called to some of the important sections of Traffic Ordinances Nos. 1067 and 1153. Parking in alleys is prohibited. Parking within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.

Double parking is prohibited. Parking between the hours of 2 and 3 a. m. in the fire limits. No turning on red light of block. Must make full stop at intersections of through streets.

The traffic officer and police have orders to rigidly enforce all traffic ordinances. The city asks the co-operation of the public. The court is held in the City Hall at 7:30 each evening.

ORDINANCE NO. 1231, SERIES 1931

An ordinance to prohibit the use of roller skates within the established fire limits of the City of La Grande, Oregon.

Section 1.—That any person violating this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$25.00, or imprisonment in the city jail not more than 10 days, or both such fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the court.

Section 2.—Whereas, the safety of pedestrians upon the sidewalks within said district, and the good order of the city, demand immediate action in this matter, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and adoption.

Passed and adopted by the Commission of the City of La Grande, Oregon, this 11th day of February, 1931, by 3 Commissioners voting in favor.
