BUTTER TONE FIRM; PRICES ARE STEADY

PORTLAND, Feb. 18 (A) — Whole sale butter and egg prices opened unchanged today. Butter tone was firm with supplies increased to about even with demand which was fairly active on all grades. Buying, however, was mainly for immediate needs.

Eggs continued to rule easy. Supplies were liberal and price shading continued. Increased consumption as result of low prices, was noticeable.

Country dressed meats and poultry were steady.

Fresh fruits and vegetables opened at generally steady price levels. Conditions in the trade were reported by the government market news service as follows:

Export apple loadings are not heavy, with prospects of 100 cars to go aboard ships this week at Portland. Oregon yellow Newtowns now comprise almost the entire export
