Menus Of The Day

By Mrs. Alexander George A WASHINGTON'S BIRTHDAY LUNCHEON

Shield Rolls Currant Jam Stuffed Tomato Salads Colonial Cheese Wafers Washington Pies Coffee

Continental Croquettes, Serving 8 1 cup chopped cooked veal, 1 1/2 cups chopped cooked pork, 1/2 cup chopped ham (cooked), 5 tablespoons butter, 6 tablespoons flour, 2 cups milk, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon paprika, 2 tablespoons chopped onions, 2 tablespoons cooked parsley, 3 tablespoons finely chopped celery, 1 egg.

Melt the butter and add the flour. Add the milk. Cook until very thick sauce forms. Stir constantly. Add rest of ingredients. Mix well and cool. Dip tablespoons of the mixture into the egg and crumb mixture.

Egg and Crumb Mixture 1/2 cup butter, 2 egg yolks or 1 egg, 2 tablespoons cold water, 2 cups rolled cracker crumbs, Beat egg yolks and water. Dip veal mixture into the crumbs, then into the egg mixture and again into the crumbs. Shape into cones. Chill and when ready to serve fry until brown, in deep hot fat. Insert little red, white and blue cockades and serve at once.

Washington Pies 1/2 cup butter, 1 1/2 cups sugar, 1 cup milk, 3 eggs, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1/4 teaspoon lemon extract, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 2 1/2 cups pastry flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, Cream the butter and sugar. Add rest of ingredients and beat 3 minutes. This beating is very important. Half fill greased muffin pans and bake 15 minutes in a moderate oven. When cool, insert filling.

Filling 1/2 cup sugar, 5 tablespoons flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt.
