Butter a Cent Higher On All Grades Today

PORTLAND, Feb. 26 (AP) — Portland's firm butter market opened 1 cent higher wholesale on all grades today. Receipts were light and demand good. Quote: cube extras 30 cents, standards 29 cents, prime firsts 28 cents and firsts 27 cents.

Strength in the butter market resulted in advance of butterfat bids 2 cents to 25 cents delivered Portland.

Wholesale egg market opened easy again with liberal receipts and price concessions to a fair trade demand. Undergrade offerings were heavy.

Only price change in the fresh fruit and vegetable trade was 25 cents per lug drop on tomatoes, from Mexico, to stimulate more buying interest in liberal supplies of fair quality.

Other highlights of the trade were reported by government market news service as follows:

Roseburg cauliflower is now being received by motor-truck at Portland. Receipts to about a carload daily, although there have been no carload shipments yet. An occasional carload of U. S. No. 1 California "flower" is now being received, but most California stock is only fair to ordinary.

Local potatoes are moving into consumption quite actively, with carload receipts from outside points almost negligible. Prices continue very low, and the local supply far exceeds the demand.

Bulls Give Street Another Whirl

NEW YORK, Feb. 26 (AP) — Bulls gave the stock market another whirl today but ran into a flurry of profit taking in the final few minutes which cancelled most of the advance.

U. S. Steel, which has been kept in reserve lately, was brought forward as a leader, and sent up nearly 4 points. It closed up about 2 net. Electric power issues, however, held the lead in group strength. The general list closed irregularly higher, with numerous gains of 1 to 4 points. Sales aggregated 4,600,000 shares.

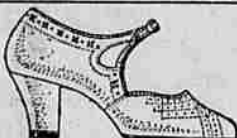

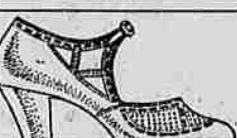
