Senators Kill Bill Aimed at Land Tax. SALEM, Feb. 28 (AP)—The senate killed by indefinite postponement yesterday the senate duplicate of the most house joint resolution calling for a constitutional amendment to prohibit the levy of a state tax on real or tangible property.

Several members spoke for the resolution, but Senator B. L. Eddy, chairman of the committee on assessment and taxation, said that the committee considered the measure unwise at a time when state finances are in the present serious condition. Should the intangibles, excise and other measures on the tax problem be disrupted in any way he said there would be nothing to fall back on if it were impossible to levy a state property tax.

The intangibles and excise tax bills will be read in the senate tomorrow. Both have passed the house.

Although a few slight advances in price were noted on individual offerings of rawing, no general upward movement was seen in the market.
